<b>apathetic about</b>	Marked by a lack of interest.
<b>blasé</b>	Uninterested because of frequent exposure or indulgence.
<b>blithe</b>	Showing a casual and cheerful indifference considered to be callous or improper. <i>Was loved for her <b>blithe</b> spirit.</i>
<b>bored by</b>	Tired of the world.
<b>carefree</b>	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>The <b>carefree</b> joys of childhood.</i>
<b><u>casual</u></b>	Characterized by a feeling of irresponsibility. <i>Using their Christian names in a <b>casual</b> way.</i>
<b>cool, calm, and collected</b>	Neither warm nor very cold; giving relief from heat.
<b>deaf to</b>	Unwilling or refusing to pay heed.
<b>dispassionate about</b>	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice.
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
<b>heedless of</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt.

<b>incurious about</b>	On the move.
<b>indifferent about</b>	Marked by no especial liking or dislike or preference for one thing over another.
<b>insouciant</b>	Showing a casual lack of concern. <i>An <b>insouciant</b> shrug.</i>
<b><u>nonchalant</u></b>	(of a person or manner) feeling or appearing casually calm and relaxed; not displaying anxiety, interest, or enthusiasm. <i>Drove his car with <b>nonchalant</b> abandon.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Without strain or anxiety. <i>The <b>relaxed</b> atmosphere of the hotel.</i>
<b><u>serene</u></b>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>A <b>serene</b> expression on her face.</i>
<b>uninterested in</b>	Not having or showing interest.
<b>uninvolved in</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>unmindful of</b>	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw.
<b>unperturbed</b>	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension. <i>Kenneth seems <b>unperturbed</b> by the news.</i>
<b>unruffled</b>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Robbie seemed <b>unruffled</b> by her words.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i><b>Untroubled</b> sleep.</i>
<b><u>unworried</u></b>	Not anxious or uneasy. <i>Foreign investors are largely <b>unworried</b> by the government's fall.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Unconcerned" as an adjective

- *Blithely unconcerned about his friend's plight.*
- *The prisoner seems entirely unconcerned as to the outcome of the examination.*
- *Readers unconcerned with style.*
- *Scott seemed unconcerned by his companion's problem.*
- *The average American...is unconcerned that his or her plight is the result of a complex of personal and economic and governmental actions...beyond the normal citizen's comprehension and control.*



## Associations of "Unconcerned" (30 Words)

**absentminded** Lost in thought; showing preoccupation.  
An ***absentminded*** professor.

**apathetic** Marked by a lack of interest.  
A woman who became active rather than ***apathetic*** as she grew older.



<b>blase</b>	Very sophisticated especially because of surfeit; versed in the ways of the world. <i>A <b>blase</b> attitude about housecleaning.</i>
<b>blithe</b>	Lacking or showing a lack of due concern. <i>A <b>blithe</b> disregard for the rules of the road.</i>
<b>carefree</b>	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i><b>Carefree</b> with his money.</i>
<b>careless</b>	Marked by lack of attention or consideration or forethought or thoroughness; not careful. <i>It was a <b>careless</b> mistake.</i>
<b>casual</b>	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. <i><b>Casual</b> jobs.</i>
<b>cloistered</b>	Of communal life sequestered from the world under religious vows. <i>A <b>cloistered</b> upbringing.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Lacking affection or warm feeling. <i><b>Detached</b> youth workers.</i>
<b>dispirited</b>	Marked by low spirits; showing no enthusiasm. <i>A <b>dispirited</b> and divided Party.</i>
<b>disregard</b>	Bar from attention or consideration. <i>The body of evidence is too substantial to <b>disregard</b>.</i>
<b>effortless</b>	Requiring no physical or mental exertion. <i>I went up the steps in two <b>effortless</b> bounds.</i>
<b>forgetful</b>	Apt or likely not to remember. <i>I m a bit <b>forgetful</b> these days.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Having or bringing good fortune.
<b>heedless</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt. <i>The <b>heedless</b> generosity and the spasmodic extravagance of persons used to large fortunes.</i>
<b>inattention</b>	Lack of attention. <i>His <b>inattention</b> to duty.</i>
<b>inattentive</b>	Not paying attention to something. <i>I was disappointed by the food and the <b>inattentive</b> service.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Marked by no especial liking or dislike or preference for one thing over another. <i>A couple of <b>indifferent</b> hills to climb.</i>

<b>insouciant</b>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>An elegantly <b>insouciant</b> manner.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>He lived a very <b>isolated</b> existence.</i>
<b>neglectful</b>	Failing in what duty requires. <i>You are being <b>neglectful</b> of our guests.</i>
<u><b>nonchalant</b></u>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>She gave a <b>nonchalant</b> shrug.</i>
<u><b>oblivious</b></u>	Not aware of or concerned about what is happening around one. <i>She became absorbed <b>oblivious</b> to the passage of time.</i>
<u><b>regardless</b></u>	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>They were determined to carry on <b>regardless</b>.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>Make sure that your jaw is <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<u><b>undisturbed</b></u>	Untroubled by interference or disturbance. <i>He could pursue his studies <b>undisturbed</b>.</i>
<b>uninterested</b>	Not having or showing interest. <i>An <b>uninterested</b> spectator.</i>
<b>unmindful</b>	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. <i>Not <b>unmindful</b> of the heavy responsibility.</i>
<b>unmolested</b>	Not pestered or molested; left in peace. <i>They allowed him to pass <b>unmolested</b>.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i>Seemed <b>untroubled</b> by doubts of any kind.</i>
