apathetic about	Marked by a lack of interest.
blasé	Uninterested because of frequent exposure or indulgence. Showing a casual and cheerful indifference considered to be callous or improper.
blithe	<i>Was loved for her blithe spirit.</i>
bored by	Tired of the world.
carefree	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>The carefree joys of childhood.</i>
casual	Characterized by a feeling of irresponsibility. <i>Using their Christian names in a casual way.</i>
cool, calm, and collected	Neither warm nor very cold; giving relief from heat.
deaf to	Unwilling or refusing to pay heed.
dispassionate about	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice.
happy-go-lucky	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
heedless of	Marked by or paying little heed or attention—Franklin D. Roosevelt.

incurious about	On the move.
indifferent about	Marked by no especial liking or dislike or preference for one thing over another.
insouciant	Showing a casual lack of concern. <i>An insouciant shrug.</i>
<u>nonchalant</u>	(of a person or manner) feeling or appearing casually calm and relaxed; not displaying anxiety, interest, or enthusiasm. <i>Drove his car with nonchalant abandon.</i>
relaxed	Without strain or anxiety. <i>The relaxed atmosphere of the hotel.</i>
<u>serene</u>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>A serene expression on her face.</i>
uninterested in	Not having or showing interest.
uninvolved in	Directed or bound inward.
unmindful of	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw.
unperturbed	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension. <i>Kenneth seems unperturbed by the news.</i>
unruffled	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Robbie seemed unruffled by her words.</i>
untroubled	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i>Untroubled sleep.</i>
<u>unworried</u>	Not anxious or uneasy. <i>Foreign investors are largely unworried by the government's fall.</i>



Usage Examples of "Unconcerned" as an adjective

- *Blithely unconcerned about his friend's plight.*
- *The prisoner seems entirely unconcerned as to the outcome of the examination.*
- *Readers unconcerned with style.*
- *Scott seemed unconcerned by his companion's problem.*
- *The average American...is unconcerned that his or her plight is the result of a complex of personal and economic and governmental actions...beyond the normal citizen's comprehension and control.*

absentminded Lost in thought; showing preoccupation.
An *absentminded* professor.

apathetic Marked by a lack of interest.
A woman who became active rather than *apathetic* as she grew older.

blase	Very sophisticated especially because of surfeit; versed in the ways of the world. <i>A blase attitude about housecleaning.</i>
blithe	Lacking or showing a lack of due concern. <i>A blithe disregard for the rules of the road.</i>
carefree	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>Carefree with his money.</i>
careless	Marked by lack of attention or consideration or forethought or thoroughness; not careful. <i>It was a careless mistake.</i>
casual	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. <i>Casual jobs.</i>
cloistered	Of communal life sequestered from the world under religious vows. <i>A cloistered upbringing.</i>
detached	Lacking affection or warm feeling. <i>Detached youth workers.</i>
dispirited	Marked by low spirits; showing no enthusiasm. <i>A dispirited and divided Party.</i>
disregard	Bar from attention or consideration. <i>The body of evidence is too substantial to disregard.</i>
effortless	Requiring no physical or mental exertion. <i>I went up the steps in two effortless bounds.</i>
forgetful	Apt or likely not to remember. <i>I m a bit forgetful these days.</i>
happy-go-lucky	Having or bringing good fortune.
heedless	Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt. <i>The heedless generosity and the spasmodic extravagance of persons used to large fortunes.</i>
inattention	Lack of attention. <i>His inattention to duty.</i>
inattentive	Not paying attention to something. <i>I was disappointed by the food and the inattentive service.</i>
indifferent	Marked by no especial liking or dislike or preference for one thing over another. <i>A couple of indifferent hills to climb.</i>

insouciant	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>An elegantly insouciant manner.</i>
isolated	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>He lived a very isolated existence.</i>
neglectful	Failing in what duty requires. <i>You are being neglectful of our guests.</i>
<u>nonchalant</u>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>She gave a nonchalant shrug.</i>
<u>oblivious</u>	Not aware of or concerned about what is happening around one. <i>She became absorbed oblivious to the passage of time.</i>
<u>regardless</u>	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>They were determined to carry on regardless.</i>
relaxed	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>Make sure that your jaw is relaxed.</i>
<u>undisturbed</u>	Untroubled by interference or disturbance. <i>He could pursue his studies undisturbed.</i>
uninterested	Not having or showing interest. <i>An uninterested spectator.</i>
unmindful	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. <i>Not unmindful of the heavy responsibility.</i>
unmolested	Not pestered or molested; left in peace. <i>They allowed him to pass unmolested.</i>
untroubled	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i>Seemed untroubled by doubts of any kind.</i>
