- That part of the mind wherein psychic activity takes place of which the person is unaware.






# Synonyms of "Unconscious" as a noun (8 Words)

<u>ego</u>	The conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
id	A card or badge used to identify the bearer. The conflict between the drives of the <b>id</b> and the demands of the cultural superego.
<u>psyche</u>	(Greek mythology) a beautiful princess loved by Cupid who visited her at night and told her she must not try to see him; became the personification of the soul. <i>How does constant losing affect the</i> <b>psyches</b> of young athletes.
<u>self</u>	Used ironically to refer to oneself or someone else. To love in an unpossessive way implies the total surrender of <b>self</b> .
<u>subconscious</u>	The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred. Uncertainties were lurking around the edge of her <b>subconscious</b> .
subconscious mind	Psychic activity just below the level of awareness.



superego	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.
unconscious mind	That part of the mind wherein psychic activity takes place of which the person is unaware.

## **Unconscious as an Adjective**


#### Definitions of "Unconscious" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "unconscious" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Without conscious volition.
- Not conscious; lacking awareness and the capacity for sensory perception as if asleep or dead.
- Not awake and aware of and responding to one's environment.
- (followed by `of') not knowing or perceiving.

- Done or existing without one realizing.
- Unaware of.

accidental	Incidental; subsidiary. The character s motives remain <b>accidental</b> to the plot.
comatose	Relating to or associated with a coma. She lay <b>comatose</b> in the sun listening to a personal stereo.
heedless	Marked by or paying little heed or attention. <i>Heedless</i> of danger.
in a coma	Holding office.
inadvertent	Happening by chance or unexpectedly or unintentionally. An <b>inadvertent</b> administrative error occurred that resulted in an overpayment.
<u>inert</u>	Lacking the ability or strength to move. She lay <b>inert</b> in her bed.
insensate	Lacking sympathy or compassion; unfeeling. <i>Insensate jabbering</i> .
insensible	Unresponsive to stimulation. They slept on <b>insensible</b> to the headlight beams.



insentient	Devoid of feeling and consciousness and animation. It s arrogant to presume animals to be <b>insentient</b> .
passed out	Of advancing the ball by throwing it.
senseless	(of especially persons) lacking sense or understanding or judgment. <i>Drugged and senseless</i> .
taking no notice	Very attractive; capturing interest.
unheeding	Not paying attention. Mary <b>unheeding</b> watched the television.
<u>unintended</u>	Not deliberate. The <b>unintended</b> consequences of people s actions.
<u>unintentional</u>	Without deliberate intent- George Macdonald. An <b>unintentional</b> pun.
unmindful	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. Danielle seemed <b>unmindful</b> of her parents plight.
<u>unplanned</u>	Not done with purpose or intent. Accepts an <b>unplanned</b> order.
unpremeditated	Not prepared or planned in advance. It was a totally <b>unpremeditated</b> attack.
unthinking	Mentally sluggish. She was at pains to correct <b>unthinking</b> prejudices.
unwitting	(of a person) not aware of the full facts. We are anxious to rectify the <b>unwitting</b> mistakes made in the past.






#### Usage Examples of "Unconscious" as an adjective

<u>unaware</u>	(often followed by `of') not aware. Seemed <b>unaware</b> of the scrutiny.
unconsciously	, Without awareness. Ben smiled <b>unconsciously</b> when he heard her voice.
<u>unintended</u>	Not deliberate. The <b>unintended</b> consequences of people s actions.
