Synonyms of "Uncontrolled" as an adjective (24 Words)

immoderate	Not sensible or restrained; excessive. <i>Immoderate laughter.</i>
incontinent	Not having control over urination and defecation. <i>Elderly incontinent parents.</i>
intemperate	(of weather or climate) not mild; subject to extremes. <i>An intemperate social occasion.</i>
out of control	No longer fashionable.
out of hand	Outer or outlying.
rampant	Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile. <i>Rampant sex.</i>
runaway	Completely out of control. <i>Runaway inflation.</i>
unbounded	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>The possibilities are unbounded.</i>
unbridled	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. <i>Unbridled rage.</i>
unchecked	(especially of something undesirable) not controlled or restrained. <i>The broadcast was sloppy it was unchecked there was no investigation of the facts.</i>
unconfined	Free from confinement or physical restraint. <i>Sows should be unconfined at farrowing.</i>

unconstrained	Not restricted or limited. <i>Idle unconstrained gossip.</i>
uncurbed	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Their activities continue to be largely uncurbed.</i>
undisciplined	Lacking in discipline or control. <i>Undisciplined talent.</i>
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
unhampered	Not impeded or encumbered. <i>This would give black people the opportunity to live unhampered by racism.</i>
unimpeded	Not obstructed or hindered. <i>An unimpeded view across the headland.</i>
uninhibited	Not having been restrained or suppressed. <i>A lively and uninhibited girl.</i>
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
unrestrained	Not restrained or restricted. <i>A display of unrestrained delight.</i>
unrestricted	Not restricted or modified in meaning. <i>Unrestricted access to both military bases.</i>
unsuppressed	Not restrained or repressed. <i>Unsuppressed feelings.</i>
untrammelled	Not deprived of freedom of action or expression; not restricted or hampered. <i>A mind untrammelled by convention.</i>
wild	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>Who even in their wildest dreams could have anticipated such a victory.</i>

Usage Examples of "Uncontrolled" as an adjective

- *In mice, the growth was uncontrolled and resembled cancer.*
- *The greatest uncontrolled health problem is AIDS.*
- *Some uncontrolled children rather marred the proceedings.*
