- Lacking art or knowledge.

artless Without skill or finesse.

An **artless** naive girl.

blunt (of a cutting implement) not having a sharp edge or point.

A **blunt** statement of fact.

boorish Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance.

Was **boorish** and insensitive.

brusque

Marked by rude or peremptory shortness.

She could be brusque and impatient.

brutish Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility.

He was coarse and brutish.

churlish Having a bad disposition; surly.

Churlish as a bear.

coarseRelating to the sport of angling for coarse fish.

Under the microscope they are seen to contain coarse grains.



Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by

<u>crude</u> simplicity and often crudeness.

Crude oil.

Marked by rude or peremptory shortness.

A **curt** reply.

discourteous Showing no courtesy; rude.

It would be unkind and **discourteous** to decline a visit.

ill-bred Lacking in refinement or grace.ill-mannered Socially incorrect in behavior.

impolite Not polite.

It would have been **impolite** to refuse.

loutish Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance.

Youths responsible for awful loutish behaviour.

oafish Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance.

Oafish behaviour.

roughcast Of a building or part of a building coated with roughcast.

She thought of the **roughcast** yeomen she would meet.

Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by

rude simplicity and often crudeness.

A rude coffin.

uncivil Discourteous; impolite.

He d been short and **uncivil** with her.

uncouth Lacking good manners, refinement, or grace.

Uncouth sketches of peasants.

Not prepared for raising crops.

uncultivated

An ignorant and uncultivated soldier.

Not befitting a gentleman.

ungentlemanly An ungentlemanly lac

An **ungentlemanly** lack of sportsmanship.

ungracious Lacking social graces.

After Anna s kindness I wouldn t want to seem **ungracious**.

unladylike Not appropriate for or typical of a well-bred, decorous woman.

Sharon gave an **unladylike** snort.

unmannerly Socially incorrect in behavior.

Uncouth **unmannerly** fellows.

unrefined (used of persons and their behavior) not refined; uncouth.

Unrefined sugar.
