Synonyms of "Uncultured" as an adjective (26 Words)

artless	Without skill or finesse. <i>An artless naive girl.</i>
blunt	(of a cutting implement) not having a sharp edge or point. <i>A blunt statement of fact.</i>
boorish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Was boorish and insensitive.</i>
<u>brusque</u>	Marked by rude or peremptory shortness. <i>She could be brusque and impatient.</i>
brutish	Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility. <i>He was coarse and brutish.</i>
churlish	Having a bad disposition; surly. <i>Churlish as a bear.</i>
coarse	Relating to the sport of angling for coarse fish. <i>Under the microscope they are seen to contain coarse grains.</i>

<u>crude</u>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. Crude oil.
<u>curt</u>	Marked by rude or peremptory shortness. A curt reply.
<u>discourteous</u>	Showing no courtesy; rude. <i>It would be unkind and discourteous to decline a visit.</i>
ill-bred	Lacking in refinement or grace.
ill-mannered	Socially incorrect in behavior.
impolite	Not polite. <i>It would have been impolite to refuse.</i>
loutish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Youths responsible for awful loutish behaviour.</i>
oafish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. Oafish behaviour.
roughcast	Of a building or part of a building coated with roughcast. <i>She thought of the roughcast yeomen she would meet.</i>
rude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. A rude coffin.
uncivil	Discourteous; impolite. <i>He d been short and uncivil with her.</i>
uncouth	Lacking good manners, refinement, or grace. Uncouth sketches of peasants.
uncultivated	Not prepared for raising crops. <i>An ignorant and uncultivated soldier.</i>
ungentlemanly	Not befitting a gentleman. <i>An ungentlemanly lack of sportsmanship.</i>
ungracious	Lacking social graces. <i>After Anna s kindness I wouldn t want to seem ungracious.</i>
unladylike	Not appropriate for or typical of a well-bred, decorous woman. <i>Sharon gave an unladylike snort.</i>
unmannerly	Socially incorrect in behavior. <i>Uncouth unmannerly fellows.</i>
<u>unrefined</u>	(used of persons and their behavior) not refined; uncouth. Unrefined sugar.



Usage Examples of "Uncultured" as an adjective

- *To my uncultured palate most of the wines were good.*
