- *Not brought to a conclusion; subject to further thought.*
- *Characterized by indecision.*
- *Not yet having made a commitment.*
- *(of a person) not having made a decision.*



Synonyms of "Undecided" as an adjective (26 Words)

<u>ambivalent</u>	Uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow. <i>Some loved her some hated her few were ambivalent about her.</i>
doubtful	Not established as genuine or acceptable. <i>I was doubtful of my judgement.</i>
<u>dubious</u>	Hesitating or doubting. <i>Timeshare has been brought into disrepute by dubious sales methods.</i>
floating	Not firmly connected; movable or out of normal position. <i>A floating kidney.</i>
<u>hazy</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>School leavers were often hazy about employment.</i>
hesitant	Lacking decisiveness of character; unable to act or decide quickly or firmly. <i>Her slow hesitant way of speaking.</i>
in two minds	Holding office.
<u>indecisive</u>	Not definitely settling something. <i>A long and indecisive war.</i>

indefinite	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>He would not answer so indefinite a proposal.</i>
irresolute	Uncertain how to act or proceed. <i>She stood irresolute outside his door.</i>
open	Of a victor having won an open competition. <i>An open economy.</i>
oscillating	Having periodic vibrations.
split	Cut or ripped longitudinally with the grain. <i>We bought split logs for the fireplace.</i>
tentative	Done without confidence; hesitant. <i>He eventually tried a few tentative steps round his hospital room.</i>
torn	Disrupted by the pull of contrary forces. <i>Torn between love and hate.</i>
uncertain	Ambiguous (especially in the negative). <i>The issue is uncertain.</i>
unclear	Poorly stated or described. <i>Users are still unclear about what middleware does.</i>
uncommitted	(of resources) not pledged or set aside for future use. <i>Uncommitted voters.</i>
undetermined	Not authoritatively decided or settled. <i>The acquisition will result in an as yet undetermined number of lay offs.</i>
unresolved	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>A number of issues remain unresolved.</i>
unsettled	(of a bill) not yet paid. <i>A spell of unsettled weather.</i>
unsure	(of a fact) not fixed or certain. <i>She was unsure how to reply.</i>
vacillating	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>He was accused of vacillating leadership.</i>
vague	Of uncertain, indefinite, or unclear character or meaning. <i>Many patients suffer vague symptoms.</i>
wavering	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>A wavering flame.</i>
wobbling	Fluctuating unsteadily. <i>A low pitched wobbling sound.</i>



Usage Examples of "Undecided" as an adjective

- *Our position on this bill is still undecided.*
- *The match was still undecided.*
- *Undecided voters.*
- *Too many voters still declare they are undecided.*
- *The jury remained undecided.*

- ambiguous** Not clear or decided.
Ambiguous phrases.
- ambiguously** So as to be open to doubt or uncertainty.
*This letter is worded **ambiguously**.*
- ambivalent** Having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone.
*Some loved her some hated her few were **ambivalent** about her.*
- boggle** (of a person) hesitate to do or accept.
*The mind **boggles** at the spectacle.*
- doubt** Consider unlikely or have doubts about.
*I **doubt** not any ones contradicting this Journal.*
- doubtful** Fraught with uncertainty or doubt.
*It is **doubtful** whether these schemes have any lasting effect.*

equivocal	(of a person) using ambiguous or evasive language. <i>The polling had a complex and equivocal or ambiguous message for potential female candidates.</i>
floating	Continually changing especially as from one abode or occupation to another. <i>Floating exchange rates.</i>
hesitant	Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking. <i>Clients are hesitant about buying.</i>
hesitate	Pause in indecision before saying or doing something. <i>He hesitated to spoil the mood by being inquisitive.</i>
hesitating	Lacking decisiveness of character; unable to act or decide quickly or firmly. <i>Her hesitating gait.</i>
hesitation	The action of pausing before saying or doing something. <i>She answered without hesitation.</i>
imprecise	Lacking exactness and accuracy of expression or detail. <i>The witness could give only vague and imprecise descriptions.</i>
inconclusive	Not conclusive; not putting an end to doubt or question. <i>An inconclusive reply.</i>
<u>indecisive</u>	Characterized by lack of decision and firmness. <i>Indecisive boundaries running through mountains.</i>
indeterminate	(of a quantity) having no definite or definable value. <i>0 0 is an indeterminate form.</i>
irresolute	Showing or feeling hesitancy; uncertain. <i>She stood irresolute outside his door.</i>
irresolution	Hesitancy; uncertainty. <i>A moment of irresolution.</i>
reluctant	Unwillingness to do something contrary to your custom. <i>Reluctant to help.</i>
<u>suspicious</u>	Causing one to have the idea or impression that someone or something is questionable, dishonest, or dangerous. <i>Suspicious behavior.</i>
unattached	Not fastened together. <i>She began to wonder if he was unattached.</i>
<u>uncertain</u>	Ambiguous (especially in the negative). <i>A manuscript of uncertain origin.</i>

<u>uncertainty</u>	Something that is uncertain or that causes one to feel uncertain. <i>Times of uncertainty and danger.</i>
<u>unclear</u>	Having or feeling doubt or confusion. <i>Users are still unclear about what middleware does.</i>
uncommitted	Not bound or pledged. <i>There is very little uncommitted money to fund new policies.</i>
unresolved	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>Many problems remain unresolved.</i>
unsettled	Still in doubt. <i>They charge interest on debts that remain unsettled after 30 days.</i>
vacillating	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>He was accused of vacillating leadership.</i>
<u>vague</u>	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So. <i>Saw a vague outline of a building through the fog.</i>
vaguely	In a way that is uncertain, indefinite or unclear; roughly. <i>He vaguely remembered talking to her once.</i>
