## Undecided as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Undecided" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “undecided” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not settled or resolved.*
- *Not brought to a conclusion; subject to further thought.*
- *Characterized by indecision.*
- *Not yet having made a commitment.*
- *(of a person) not having made a decision.*



## Synonyms of "Undecided" as an adjective (26 Words)

<b><u>ambivalent</u></b>	Uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow. <i>Some loved her some hated her few were <b>ambivalent</b> about her.</i>
<b>doubtful</b>	Not established as genuine or acceptable. <i>I was <b>doubtful</b> of my judgement.</i>
<b><u>dubious</u></b>	Hesitating or doubting. <i>Timeshare has been brought into disrepute by <b>dubious</b> sales methods.</i>
<b>floating</b>	Not firmly connected; movable or out of normal position. <i>A <b>floating</b> kidney.</i>
<b><u>hazy</u></b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>School leavers were often <b>hazy</b> about employment.</i>
<b>hesitant</b>	Lacking decisiveness of character; unable to act or decide quickly or firmly. <i>Her slow <b>hesitant</b> way of speaking.</i>
<b>in two minds</b>	Holding office.
<b><u>indecisive</u></b>	Not definitely settling something. <i>A long and <b>indecisive</b> war.</i>

<b>indefinite</b>	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>He would not answer so <b>indefinite</b> a proposal.</i>
<b>irresolute</b>	Uncertain how to act or proceed. <i>She stood <b>irresolute</b> outside his door.</i>
<b>open</b>	Of a victor having won an open competition. <i>An <b>open</b> economy.</i>
<b>oscillating</b>	Having periodic vibrations.
<b>split</b>	Cut or ripped longitudinally with the grain. <i>We bought <b>split</b> logs for the fireplace.</i>
<b>tentative</b>	Done without confidence; hesitant. <i>He eventually tried a few <b>tentative</b> steps round his hospital room.</i>
<b>torn</b>	Disrupted by the pull of contrary forces. <i><b>Torn</b> between love and hate.</i>
<b>uncertain</b>	Ambiguous (especially in the negative). <i>The issue is <b>uncertain</b>.</i>
<b>unclear</b>	Poorly stated or described. <i>Users are still <b>unclear</b> about what middleware does.</i>
<b>uncommitted</b>	(of resources) not pledged or set aside for future use. <i><b>Uncommitted</b> voters.</i>
<b>undetermined</b>	Not authoritatively decided or settled. <i>The acquisition will result in an as yet <b>undetermined</b> number of lay offs.</i>
<b>unresolved</b>	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>A number of issues remain <b>unresolved</b>.</i>
<b>unsettled</b>	(of a bill) not yet paid. <i>A spell of <b>unsettled</b> weather.</i>
<b>unsure</b>	(of a fact) not fixed or certain. <i>She was <b>unsure</b> how to reply.</i>
<b>vacillating</b>	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>He was accused of <b>vacillating</b> leadership.</i>
<b>vague</b>	Of uncertain, indefinite, or unclear character or meaning. <i>Many patients suffer <b>vague</b> symptoms.</i>
<b>wavering</b>	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>A <b>wavering</b> flame.</i>
<b>wobbling</b>	Fluctuating unsteadily. <i>A low pitched <b>wobbling</b> sound.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Undecided" as an adjective

- *Our position on this bill is still undecided.*
- *The match was still undecided.*
- *Undecided voters.*
- *Too many voters still declare they are undecided.*
- *The jury remained undecided.*



## Associations of "Undecided" (30 Words)

- ambiguous** Not clear or decided.  
*Ambiguous phrases.*
- ambiguously** So as to be open to doubt or uncertainty.  
*This letter is worded **ambiguously**.*
- ambivalent** Having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone.  
*Some loved her some hated her few were **ambivalent** about her.*
- boggle** (of a person) hesitate to do or accept.  
*The mind **boggles** at the spectacle.*
- doubt** Consider unlikely or have doubts about.  
*I **doubt** not any ones contradicting this Journal.*
- doubtful** Fraught with uncertainty or doubt.  
*It is **doubtful** whether these schemes have any lasting effect.*

<b>equivocal</b>	(of a person) using ambiguous or evasive language. <i>The polling had a complex and <b>equivocal</b> or ambiguous message for potential female candidates.</i>
<b>floating</b>	Continually changing especially as from one abode or occupation to another. <i><b>Floating</b> exchange rates.</i>
<b>hesitant</b>	Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking. <i>Clients are <b>hesitant</b> about buying.</i>
<b>hesitate</b>	Pause in indecision before saying or doing something. <i>He <b>hesitated</b> to spoil the mood by being inquisitive.</i>
<b>hesitating</b>	Lacking decisiveness of character; unable to act or decide quickly or firmly. <i>Her <b>hesitating</b> gait.</i>
<b>hesitation</b>	The action of pausing before saying or doing something. <i>She answered without <b>hesitation</b>.</i>
<b>imprecise</b>	Lacking exactness and accuracy of expression or detail. <i>The witness could give only vague and <b>imprecise</b> descriptions.</i>
<b>inconclusive</b>	Not conclusive; not putting an end to doubt or question. <i>An <b>inconclusive</b> reply.</i>
<b><u>indecisive</u></b>	Characterized by lack of decision and firmness. <i><b>Indecisive</b> boundaries running through mountains.</i>
<b>indeterminate</b>	(of a quantity) having no definite or definable value. <i>0 0 is an <b>indeterminate</b> form.</i>
<b>irresolute</b>	Showing or feeling hesitancy; uncertain. <i>She stood <b>irresolute</b> outside his door.</i>
<b>irresolution</b>	Hesitancy; uncertainty. <i>A moment of <b>irresolution</b>.</i>
<b>reluctant</b>	Unwillingness to do something contrary to your custom. <i><b>Reluctant</b> to help.</i>
<b><u>suspicious</u></b>	Causing one to have the idea or impression that someone or something is questionable, dishonest, or dangerous. <i><b>Suspicious</b> behavior.</i>
<b>unattached</b>	Not fastened together. <i>She began to wonder if he was <b>unattached</b>.</i>
<b><u>uncertain</u></b>	Ambiguous (especially in the negative). <i>A manuscript of <b>uncertain</b> origin.</i>

<b><u>uncertainty</u></b>	Something that is uncertain or that causes one to feel uncertain. <i>Times of <b>uncertainty</b> and danger.</i>
<b><u>unclear</u></b>	Having or feeling doubt or confusion. <i>Users are still <b>unclear</b> about what middleware does.</i>
<b>uncommitted</b>	Not bound or pledged. <i>There is very little <b>uncommitted</b> money to fund new policies.</i>
<b>unresolved</b>	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>Many problems remain <b>unresolved</b>.</i>
<b>unsettled</b>	Still in doubt. <i>They charge interest on debts that remain <b>unsettled</b> after 30 days.</i>
<b>vacillating</b>	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>He was accused of <b>vacillating</b> leadership.</i>
<b><u>vague</u></b>	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So. <i>Saw a <b>vague</b> outline of a building through the fog.</i>
<b>vaguely</b>	In a way that is uncertain, indefinite or unclear; roughly. <i>He <b>vaguely</b> remembered talking to her once.</i>
