irresolute Uncertain how to act or proceed.

She stood **irresolute** outside his door.

open Of a victor having won an open competition.

An **open** economy.

oscillating Having periodic vibrations.

Cut or ripped longitudinally with the grain.

We bought **split** logs for the fireplace.

tentative Done without confidence; hesitant.

He eventually tried a few **tentative** steps round his hospital room.

Disrupted by the pull of contrary forces.

Torn between love and hate.

Ambiguous (especially in the negative.

The issue is **uncertain**.

unclear Poorly stated or described.

Users are still **unclear** about what middleware does.

uncommitted (of resources) not pledged or set aside for future use.

Uncommitted voters.

undetermined Not authoritatively decided or settled.

The acquisition will result in an as yet **undetermined** number of lay offs.

Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved.

unresolved

A number of issues remain unresolved.

unsettled (of a bill) not yet paid.

A spell of **unsettled** weather.

unsure (of a fact) not fixed or certain.

She was **unsure** how to reply.

vacillating Uncertain in purpose or action.

He was accused of **vacillating** leadership.

Of uncertain, indefinite, or unclear character or meaning.

Many patients suffer **vague** symptoms.

wavering Uncertain in purpose or action.

A **wavering** flame.

wobbling Fluctuating unsteadily.

A low pitched **wobbling** sound.

boggle (of a person) hesitate to do or accept. The mind **boggle**s at the spectacle.

Consider unlikely or have doubts about.

*doubt*I doubt not any ones contradicting this Journal.

doubtful Fraught with uncertainty or doubt.

It is **doubtful** whether these schemes have any lasting effect.



(of a person) using ambiguous or evasive language.

equivocal The polling had a complex and **equivocal** or ambiguous message for

potential female candidates.

Continually changing especially as from one abode or occupation to

floating another.

Floating exchange rates.

hesitant Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking.

Clients are **hesitant** about buying.

hesitate Pause in indecision before saying or doing something.

He **hesitate**d to spoil the mood by being inquisitive.

Lacking decisiveness of character; unable to act or decide quickly or

hesitating firmly.

Her **hesitating** gait.

hesitation The action of pausing before saying or doing something.

She answered without hesitation.

imprecise Lacking exactness and accuracy of expression or detail.

The witness could give only vague and **imprecise** descriptions.

inconclusive Not conclusive; not putting an end to doubt or question.

An **inconclusive** reply.

indecisive Characterized by lack of decision and firmness.

Indecisive boundaries running through mountains.

indeterminate (of a quantity) having no definite or definable value.

indeterminate $0 \ 0$ is an indeterminate form.

irresolute Showing or feeling hesitancy; uncertain.

She stood irresolute outside his door.

irresolution Hesitancy; uncertainty.

A moment of **irresolution**.

reluctant Unwillingness to do something contrary to your custom.

Reluctant to help.

Causing one to have the idea or impression that someone or something is

suspicious questionable, dishonest, or dangerous.

Suspicious behavior.

unattached Not fastened together.

She began to wonder if he was **unattached**.

uncertain Ambiguous (especially in the negative.

A manuscript of **uncertain** origin.



uncertainty Something that is uncertain or that causes one to feel uncertain.

Times of uncertainty and danger.

unclear Having or feeling doubt or confusion.

Users are still **unclear** about what middleware does.

uncommitted Not bound or pledged.

There is very little **uncommitted** money to fund new policies.

unresolved Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved.

Many problems remain unresolved.

unsettled Still in doubt.

They charge interest on debts that remain **unsettled** after 30 days.

vacillating Uncertain in purpose or action.

He was accused of **vacillating** leadership.

Saw a **vague** outline of a building through the fog.

vaguely

In a way that is uncertain, indefinite or unclear; roughly.

He **vaguely** remembered talking to her once.
