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Associations of "Under control" (30 Words)

ascendant	Someone from whom you are descended (but usually more remote than a grandparent. <i>That idea was in the ascendant.</i>
authority	The power or right to give orders or make decisions. <i>A rebellion against those in authority.</i>
controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully controllable.</i>
dominate	Be greater in significance than. <i>The race was dominated by the 1998 champion.</i>
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.
govern	Conduct oneself, especially with regard to controlling one's emotions. <i>He was incapable of governing the country.</i>
indiscriminately	In an indiscriminate manner. <i>People who are sedentary and who eat indiscriminately.</i>
manageable	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and manageable.</i>
mastery	Comprehensive knowledge or skill in a particular subject or activity. <i>Mastery of the seas.</i>
monocracy	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc.
monopolize	(of an organization or group) obtain exclusive possession or control of (a trade, commodity, or service). <i>OPEC wants to monopolize oil.</i>
nether	Lower. <i>Nether garments.</i>
obedience	Observance of a monastic rule. <i>Vows of poverty chastity and obedience.</i>

<u>obedient</u>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>The obedient colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
<u>obsession</u>	An irrational motive for performing trivial or repetitive actions, even against your will. <i>She cared for him with a devotion bordering on obsession.</i>
<u>overlord</u>	A ruler, especially a feudal lord. <i>The Jews rebelled against their Roman overlords.</i>
potentate	A ruler who is unconstrained by law.
<u>prevail</u>	Prove superior. <i>She was prevailed upon to give an account of her work.</i>
reign	The period during which a monarch is sovereign. <i>Confusion reigned.</i>
<u>repression</u>	The action or process of suppressing a thought or desire in oneself so that it remains unconscious. <i>An extraordinary panoply of sexual repressions and desires.</i>
rudder	Application of a rudder in steering a boat ship or aircraft. <i>Bring the aircraft to a stall and apply full rudder.</i>
<u>ruler</u>	A person exercising government or dominion.
sovereignty	The authority of a state to govern another state. <i>National sovereignty.</i>
<u>steer</u>	The type of steering of a vehicle. <i>The ship steered into port.</i>
<u>subjugation</u>	The act of conquering. <i>The fear of human subjugation by technology.</i>
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>The school was under the superintendence of the nuns of the convent.</i>
<u>supremacy</u>	The state or condition of being superior to all others in authority, power, or status. <i>The supremacy of the king.</i>
tyrannize	Rule a country as a tyrant. <i>He tyrannizes over the servants.</i>
<u>underneath</u>	On the lower or downward side; on the underside of. <i>Paint was peeling off in flakes to reveal greyish plaster underneath.</i>
