<b>amount</b>	Be tantamount or equivalent to. <i>The bills <b>amounted</b> to 2 000.</i>
<b>anticipate</b>	Realize beforehand. <i>He <b>anticipated</b> Bates s theories on mimicry and protective coloration.</i>
<b>anticipation</b>	The action of anticipating something; expectation or prediction. <i>Her eyes sparkled with <b>anticipation</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>anticipatory</b></a>	In anticipation. <i>An <b>anticipatory</b> flash of excitement.</i>
<a href="#"><b>assumed</b></a>	Adopted as a basis of reasoning; expected. <i>A man living under an <b>assumed</b> name.</i>
<b>assumption</b>	Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to. <i>The <b>assumption</b> of an active role in regional settlements.</i>
<a href="#"><b>conjecture</b></a>	To believe especially on uncertain or tentative grounds. <i>Many <b>conjectured</b> that the jury could not agree.</i>
<b>estimate</b>	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of quantities or time. <i>Compare costs by getting <b>estimates</b> from at least two firms.</i>
<a href="#"><b>expect</b></a>	Consider obligatory request and expect. <i>I m <b>expecting</b> a full explanation as to why these files were destroyed.</i>
<b>expectancy</b>	An expectation. <i>An indicator of <b>expectancy</b> in development.</i>
<b>expectation</b>	A strong belief that something will happen or be the case. <i>Reality had not lived up to <b>expectations</b>.</i>
<b>guess</b>	Form a correct conclusion about something by guessing. <i>My <b>guess</b> is that within a year we will have a referendum.</i>
<b>guesswork</b>	The process or results of guessing. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of <b>guesswork</b>.</i>

<b><u>infer</u></b>	Believe to be the case. <i>From these facts we can <b>infer</b> that crime has been increasing.</i>
<b>inference</b>	A conclusion reached on the basis of evidence and reasoning. <i>It seemed a fair <b>inference</b> that such books would be grouped together.</i>
<b>preconception</b>	A preconceived idea or prejudice. <i>He did not even try to confirm his <b>preconceptions</b>.</i>
<b><u>presumably</u></b>	By reasonable assumption. <i><b>Presumably</b> he missed the train.</i>
<b><u>presume</u></b>	Be arrogant or impertinent enough to do something. <i>I <b>presumed</b> that the man had been escorted from the building.</i>
<b><u>presumption</u></b>	An idea that is taken to be true on the basis of probability. <i>The planning policy shows a general <b>presumption</b> in favour of development.</i>
<b>presuppose</b>	Require as a necessary antecedent or precondition. <i>Your argument <b>presupposes</b> that it does not matter who is in power.</i>
<b>skimp</b>	Limit in quality or quantity. <i>She wore a yellow <b>skimp</b>.</i>
<b><u>speculate</u></b>	Invest in stocks, property, or other ventures in the hope of gain but with the risk of loss. <i>Philosophers have <b>speculated</b> on the question of God for thousands of years.</i>
<b>speculation</b>	A message expressing an opinion based on incomplete evidence. <i>The company's move into property <b>speculation</b>.</i>
<b><u>suppose</u></b>	Expect believe or suppose. <i>The procedure <b>supposes</b> that a will has already been proved.</i>
<b><u>supposedly</u></b>	According to what is generally assumed or believed (often used to indicate that the speaker doubts the truth of the statement). <i>There were rumours of a rift between him and his colleagues <b>supposedly</b> because they were jealous of his relationship with the Duchess.</i>
<b>supposition</b>	A message expressing an opinion based on incomplete evidence. <i>Their outrage was based on <b>supposition</b> and hearsay.</i>
<b><u>surmise</u></b>	Imagine to be the case or true or probable. <i>All these observations remain <b>surmise</b>.</i>
<b>turnout</b>	A set of clothing (with accessories). <i>At most junctions and crossovers the trains will be able to take the <b>turnout</b> at 230 km h.</i>
<b>underrate</b>	Make too low an estimate of. <i>They vastly <b>underrate</b> their own players.</i>
