Associations of "Undergoes" (30 Words)

affliction	The state of being in pain. <i>Poor people in great affliction.</i>
<u>astride</u>	(with reference to a person’s legs) apart. <i>He stood legs astride.</i>
<u>bear</u>	Take on as one’s own the expenses or debts of another person. <i>The squash bears fruit shaped like cucumbers.</i>
<u>bearable</u>	Capable of being borne though unpleasant. <i>Things to make life in the tropics more bearable.</i>
bleeding	Used for emphasis, or to express annoyance. <i>She looks so bleeding bored all day.</i>
dais	A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it.
easel	A wooden frame for holding an artist’s work while it is being painted or drawn.
endurable	Able to be endured; bearable. <i>My journey was long but endurable.</i>
<u>endure</u>	Last and be usable. <i>The new secretary had to endure a lot of unprofessional remarks.</i>
experience	Go through mental or physical states or experiences. <i>Audition day is an enjoyable experience for any seven year old.</i>
forbearance	The action of refraining from exercising a legal right, especially enforcing the payment of a debt. <i>His forbearance to reply was alarming.</i>
<u>metamorphosis</u>	(in an insect or amphibian) the process of transformation from an immature form to an adult form in two or more distinct stages. <i>In insects with a complete metamorphosis the wings arise from thickenings of the epidermis.</i>

orthopedic	Of or relating to orthopedics. <i>Orthopedic shoes.</i>
pain	Cause mental or physical pain to. <i>It pains me to say this.</i>
patience	The capacity to accept or tolerate delay, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
perseverance	The act of persisting or persevering; continuing or repeating behavior. <i>His perseverance with the technique illustrates his single mindedness.</i>
persevere	Continue in a course of action even in the face of difficulty or with little or no indication of success. <i>His family persevered with his treatment.</i>
<u>persist</u>	Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>The child persisted and kept asking questions.</i>
persistence	The act of persisting or persevering; continuing or repeating behavior. <i>The persistence of huge environmental problems.</i>
principled	(of a person or their behaviour) acting in accordance with morality and showing recognition of right and wrong. <i>Principled pragmatism and unprincipled expediency.</i>
resourcefulness	The quality of being able to cope with a difficult situation. <i>A man of great resourcefulness.</i>
stand	The place where someone typically stands or sits. <i>Small stable boats that could stand the punishment of heavy seas.</i>
suffer	Undergo or suffer. <i>He suffered intense pain.</i>
sufferance	The suffering or undergoing of something bad or unpleasant. <i>An estate at sufferance.</i>
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>Suffering refugees.</i>
<u>surgery</u>	An occasion on which an MP, lawyer, or other professional person gives advice. <i>He died while undergoing surgery.</i>
<u>tolerable</u>	Able to be endured. <i>A stimulant to make life more tolerable.</i>
<u>tolerate</u>	Be capable of continued subjection to (a drug, toxin, or environmental condition) without adverse reaction. <i>He learned to tolerate the heat.</i>

toleration	The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour. <i>The king demanded greater religious toleration.</i>
tribulation	A cause of great trouble or suffering. <i>His time of tribulation was just beginning.</i>
