attenuate	Weaken the consistency of (a chemical substance. <i>The filter must severely attenuate frequencies above 10 Hz.</i>
	Oppose or check by a counteraction.
counteract	<i>Should we deliberately intervene in the climate system to counteract global warming.</i>
dampen	Make less strong or intense. <i>Slider switches on the mixers can dampen the drums.</i>
deaden	Make vague or obscure or make (an image) less visible. <i>The syllabus has deadened the teaching process.</i>
debilitate	Hinder, delay, or weaken. <i>Hard drugs destroy families and debilitate communities.</i>
decline	A disease in which the bodily strength gradually fails, especially tuberculosis. <i>The roof declines here.</i>
destabilize	Make unstable. <i>The accused were charged with conspiracy to destabilize the country.</i>
dilute	Reduce the value of (a shareholding) by issuing more shares in a company without increasing the values of its assets. <i>Dilute sun.</i>
diminish	Make or become less. <i>The pain will gradually diminish.</i>
diminished	Diminished in size or strength as a result of disease or injury or lack of use. <i>A diminished fifth.</i>
emasculate	Remove the anthers from (a flower). <i>The Senate emasculated the law.</i>
enervate	Lacking in energy or vitality. <i>The enervate slightness of his frail form.</i>

enfeeble	Make weak. <i>The breakdown in law and order enfeebled the government's authority.</i>
fading	Weakening in force or intensity.
fatigued	Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted.
flagging	A walk of flagstones. <i>There was a pile of flagging waiting to be laid in place.</i>
fragile	(of a person) not strong or sturdy; delicate and vulnerable. <i>A small fragile old lady.</i>
impotent	Unable to copulate. <i>He was seized with an impotent anger.</i>
languish	Be forced to remain in an unpleasant place or situation. <i>Kelso languish near the bottom of the Scottish First Division.</i>
reduce	Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements. <i>The cook reduced the sauce by boiling it for a long time.</i>
reduced	Made less in size or amount or degree.
rickety	(of a structure or piece of equipment) poorly made and likely to collapse. <i>We went carefully up the rickety stairs.</i>
sabotage	The action of sabotaging something. <i>A coordinated campaign of sabotage.</i>
slowly	Without speed slow is sometimes used informally for slowly. <i>They moved forward slowly.</i>
subvert	Destroy property or hinder normal operations. <i>We must not let our civil liberties be subverted by the current crisis.</i>
thinner	A diluting agent. <i>Dampen a clean rag with thinners and carefully wipe any remaining dust from the timber.</i>
unsettle	Disturb the composure of. <i>The crisis has unsettled financial markets.</i>
viability	Ability to survive or live successfully. <i>Studies to ensure the viability of the project.</i>
wane	Become smaller. <i>Interest in his novels waned.</i>
weaken	Become weaker. <i>The fever weakened his body.</i>
