
Underneath as a Noun

Underneath as an Adverb

Definitions of "Underneath" as an adverb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "underneath" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- So as to be concealed by something else.
- $\bullet \ \textit{Partly or wholly concealed by a garment}.$
- Under or below an object or a surface; at a lower place or level; directly beneath.
- On the lower or downward side; on the underside of.
- Situated directly below something else.

down Downstairs.

downwards.

lower In or into a lower position.

The sun sank **lower**.



Usage Examples of "Underneath" as an adverb

- There was plenty of storage room underneath.
- A crane lifted slabs of concrete to rescue people trapped underneath.
- He was wearing a brown jacket with a white T-shirt underneath.
- She seemed to have no emotions, but in fact she was very sensitive underneath.



• Paint was peeling off in flakes to reveal greyish plaster underneath.
