analyst	A psychoanalyst.
analyze	Consider in detail and subject to an analysis in order to discover essential features or meaning. <i>Analyze a chemical compound.</i>
applicant	A person who requests or seeks something such as assistance or employment or admission. <i>A job applicant.</i>
appraisal	A formal assessment, typically in an interview, of the performance of an employee over a particular period. <i>The report has been subject to appraisal.</i>
appraise	Assess the value or quality of. <i>He appraised the situation carefully before acting.</i>
approximation	An approximate calculation of quantity or degree or worth. <i>Newspapers gave only an approximation of the actual events.</i>
assess	Evaluate or estimate the nature, quality, ability, extent, or significance of. <i>All empty properties will be assessed at 50 per cent.</i>
assessment	The action of assessing someone or something. <i>The assessment of educational needs.</i>
calculation	An assessment of the risks, possibilities, or effects of a situation or course of action. <i>Finding ways of saving money involves complicated calculations.</i>
cancel	Subject to political religious or moral censorship. <i>The report had been cancelled in the national interest.</i>
critically	To a potentially disastrous degree. <i>A designer spoke critically of capitalism.</i>
depreciate	Reduce the recorded value in a company's books of (an asset) each year over a predetermined period. <i>The dollar depreciated again.</i>

dissect	Methodically cut up (a body or plant) in order to study its internal parts. <i>An animal's eye can be easily dissected.</i>
estimate	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of quantities or time. <i>It is estimated that smoking causes 100 000 premature deaths every year.</i>
evaluate	Evaluate or estimate the nature quality ability extent or significance of. <i>How do you evaluate this grant proposal.</i>
evaluation	Act of ascertaining or fixing the value or worth of. <i>An initial evaluation of the programme.</i>
examine	Question or examine thoroughly and closely. <i>The customs agent examined the baggage.</i>
feasibility	The quality of being doable. <i>The feasibility of screening athletes for cardiac disease.</i>
gauge	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i>When dry the assemblies can be gauged exactly and planed to width.</i>
guess	Put forward of a guess in spite of possible refutation. <i>He guessed the right number of beans in the jar and won the prize.</i>
measure	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>The states retain a large measure of independence.</i>
plumb	Adjust with a plumb line so as to make vertical. <i>The tower of Pisa is far out of plumb.</i>
pricing	The evaluation of something in terms of its price.
speculate	Form a theory or conjecture about a subject without firm evidence. <i>My colleagues speculate about my private life.</i>
statistic	A fact or piece of data obtained from a study of a large quantity of numerical data. <i>He was just another statistic.</i>
underestimate	An estimation that is too low; an estimate that is less than the true or actual value. <i>The government has grossly underestimated the extent of the problem.</i>
undervalue	A price below the real value. <i>His truck was sold at an undervalue.</i>
valuation	The monetary worth of something, especially as estimated by a valuer. <i>He set a high valuation on friendship.</i>
valued	Having value of a specified kind. <i>A valued friend.</i>
