<a href="#">analyst</a>	A psychoanalyst.
<b>analyze</b>	Consider in detail and subject to an analysis in order to discover essential features or meaning. <i><b>Analyze</b> a chemical compound.</i>
<b>applicant</b>	A person who requests or seeks something such as assistance or employment or admission. <i>A job <b>applicant</b>.</i>
<a href="#">appraisal</a>	A formal assessment, typically in an interview, of the performance of an employee over a particular period. <i>The report has been subject to <b>appraisal</b>.</i>
<b>appraise</b>	Assess the value or quality of. <i>He <b>appraised</b> the situation carefully before acting.</i>
<b>approximation</b>	An approximate calculation of quantity or degree or worth. <i>Newspapers gave only an <b>approximation</b> of the actual events.</i>
<a href="#">assess</a>	Evaluate or estimate the nature, quality, ability, extent, or significance of. <i>All empty properties will be <b>assessed</b> at 50 per cent.</i>
<b>assessment</b>	The action of assessing someone or something. <i>The <b>assessment</b> of educational needs.</i>
<b>calculation</b>	An assessment of the risks, possibilities, or effects of a situation or course of action. <i>Finding ways of saving money involves complicated <b>calculations</b>.</i>
<b>cancel</b>	Subject to political religious or moral censorship. <i>The report had been <b>cancelled</b> in the national interest.</i>
<b>critically</b>	To a potentially disastrous degree. <i>A designer spoke <b>critically</b> of capitalism.</i>
<a href="#">depreciate</a>	Reduce the recorded value in a company's books of (an asset) each year over a predetermined period. <i>The dollar <b>depreciated</b> again.</i>

<b>dissect</b>	Methodically cut up (a body or plant) in order to study its internal parts. <i>An animal's eye can be easily <b>dissected</b>.</i>
<b>estimate</b>	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of quantities or time. <i>It is <b>estimated</b> that smoking causes 100 000 premature deaths every year.</i>
<b>evaluate</b>	Evaluate or estimate the nature quality ability extent or significance of. <i>How do you <b>evaluate</b> this grant proposal.</i>
<b>evaluation</b>	Act of ascertaining or fixing the value or worth of. <i>An initial <b>evaluation</b> of the programme.</i>
<b>examine</b>	Question or examine thoroughly and closely. <i>The customs agent <b>examined</b> the baggage.</i>
<b>feasibility</b>	The quality of being doable. <i>The <b>feasibility</b> of screening athletes for cardiac disease.</i>
<b>gauge</b>	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i>When dry the assemblies can be <b>gauged</b> exactly and planed to width.</i>
<b>guess</b>	Put forward of a guess in spite of possible refutation. <i>He <b>guessed</b> the right number of beans in the jar and won the prize.</i>
<b>measure</b>	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>The states retain a large <b>measure</b> of independence.</i>
<b>plumb</b>	Adjust with a plumb line so as to make vertical. <i>The tower of Pisa is far out of <b>plumb</b>.</i>
<b>pricing</b>	The evaluation of something in terms of its price.
<b>speculate</b>	Form a theory or conjecture about a subject without firm evidence. <i>My colleagues <b>speculate</b> about my private life.</i>
<b>statistic</b>	A fact or piece of data obtained from a study of a large quantity of numerical data. <i>He was just another <b>statistic</b>.</i>
<b>underestimate</b>	An estimation that is too low; an estimate that is less than the true or actual value. <i>The government has grossly <b>underestimated</b> the extent of the problem.</i>
<b>undervalue</b>	A price below the real value. <i>His truck was sold at an <b>undervalue</b>.</i>
<b>valuation</b>	The monetary worth of something, especially as estimated by a valuer. <i>He set a high <b>valuation</b> on friendship.</i>
<b>valued</b>	Having value of a specified kind. <i>A <b>valued</b> friend.</i>
