#### Definitions of "Understatement" as a noun

- A statement that is restrained in ironic contrast to what might have been said.
- The presentation of something as being smaller or less good or important than it really is.

## Synonyms of "Understatement" as a noun (2 Words)

An inoffensive or indirect expression that is substituted for one that is **euphemism** considered offensive or too harsh.

The jargon has given us downsizing as a **euphemism** for cuts.

The representation or estimation of something at less than its true value or **minimization** importance.

Despite his **minimization** of the situation this is not a small outbreak.

- A master of English understatement.



# Associations of "Understatement" (30 Words)

**abstemious** Sparing in consumption of especially food and drink.

**Abstemious** with the use of adverbs.

A painkilling drug or medicine.

Anodyne music.

**appertain** Relate to; concern.

The institutional arrangements which **appertain** under the system.

The final path followed by an aircraft as it is landing.

approach

The initial path followed by all affectalt as it is landing.

The approach of winter.

Pertaining to or characteristic of an ascetic or the practice of rigorous self

**ascetic** discipline.

Ascetic practices.

The quality of being certain or definite.

For the sake of **clarity** each of these strategies is dealt with separately.

**contained** Gotten under control. *The oil spill is* **contained**.

**controlled** Not showing emotion; having one's feelings under control.

**Controlled** emotions.

cool Make cool or cooler.

Keep **cool**.

**directness** Trueness of course toward a goal.

He was renowned for the clarity and **directness** of his sermons.

**disciplined** Trained mentally or physically by instruction or exercise. A *disciplined* mind.

**dominated** Harassed by persistent nagging.

A downward gradient on a railway or road.

**downgrade**A downward gradient on a rankay of road. **Downgrade**s by debt rating agencies outnumber upgrades by five to one.

downplay

Make (something) appear less important than it really is.

This report downplays the seriousness of global warming.

Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount.

He rose through the ranks with apparent **ease**.

easiness Freedom from difficulty or hardship or effort.

The **easiness** we feel when sleeping.

**generality** The majority.

His service was better than that offered by the **generality** of doctors.



minimize Represent as less significant or important.

They may **minimize** or even overlook the importance of such beliefs.

mitigate Make less severe or harsh.

Drainage schemes have helped to **mitigate** this problem.

moderation A change for the better.

Coursework may need to be filed separately for the purposes of **moderation**.

**reduce** Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements.

The cook **reduce**d the sauce by boiling it for a long time.

refrain Stop oneself from doing something.

She **refrain**ed from comment.

**relaxation** The restoration of equilibrium following disturbance.

The **relaxation** of requirements.

remotely In a remote manner.

New electronic meters can be read **remotely**.

Under restraint.

**restrained** The head and chest injuries that even **restrained** drivers can suffer through

impact with the steering wheel.

simplicity

The quality or condition of being plain or uncomplicated in form or design.

The grandown and simplicity of Roman crehitecture.

The grandeur and **simplicity** of Roman architecture.

subdued (of a person or their manner) quiet and rather reflective or depressed.

A **subdued** glow came through the curtains.

Abstinence from alcoholic drink.

The **temperance** movement.

understate Represent as less significant or important.

The press have **understate**d the extent of the problem.

**undervalue** A price below the real value.

Through overfamiliarity it is easy to **undervalue** this concerto.
