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Associations of "Underwent" (30 Words)

affliction	A state of great suffering and distress due to adversity. <i>Poor people in great affliction.</i>
<u>astride</u>	(with reference to a person’s legs) apart. <i>She sat on the chair astride.</i>
<u>bear</u>	Take responsibility for. <i>Steamboats bear the traveller out of Kerrerra Sound.</i>
<u>bearable</u>	Able to be endured. <i>Things to make life in the tropics more bearable.</i>
bleeding	The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel. <i>The watch was a bleeding copy.</i>
dais	A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it.
easel	A wooden frame for holding an artist’s work while it is being painted or drawn.
endurable	Capable of being borne though unpleasant. <i>My journey was long but endurable.</i>
<u>endure</u>	Last and be usable. <i>These cities have endured through time.</i>
experience	Undergo or live through a difficult experience. <i>You should have the necessary experience in health management.</i>
forbearance	The action of refraining from exercising a legal right, especially enforcing the payment of a debt. <i>His forbearance to reply was alarming.</i>
<u>metamorphosis</u>	The marked and rapid transformation of a larva into an adult that occurs in some animals. <i>His metamorphosis from presidential candidate to talk show host.</i>

orthopedic	Of or relating to orthopedics. <i>Orthopedic shoes.</i>
pain	Cause mental or physical pain to. <i>She s a pain.</i>
patience	Any of various forms of card game for one player, the object of which is to use up all one's cards by forming particular arrangements and sequences. <i>You can find bargains if you have the patience to sift through the rubbish.</i>
perseverance	Persistent determination. <i>His perseverance with the technique illustrates his single mindedness.</i>
persevere	Be persistent, refuse to stop. <i>His family persevered with his treatment.</i>
<u>persist</u>	Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>We are persisting with policies that will create jobs for the future.</i>
persistence	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff s persistence was rewarded with a try.</i>
principled	(of a person or their behaviour) acting in accordance with morality and showing recognition of right and wrong. <i>A coherent and principled approach.</i>
resourcefulness	The quality of being able to cope with a difficult situation. <i>His films show remarkable technical resourcefulness.</i>
stand	Withstand an experience or test without being damaged. <i>The party s tough stand on immigration.</i>
suffer	Undergo or suffer. <i>This author really suffers in translation.</i>
sufferance	The suffering or undergoing of something bad or unpleasant. <i>Charles was only here on sufferance.</i>
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>A message of hope for suffering humanity.</i>
<u>surgery</u>	A medical procedure involving an incision with instruments; performed to repair damage or arrest disease in a living body. <i>He read the warning in the doctor s surgery.</i>
<u>tolerable</u>	Able to be endured. <i>He was fond of music and had a tolerable voice.</i>

tolerate

Allow the presence of or allow (an activity) without opposing or prohibiting.

*How was it that she could **tolerate** such noise.*

toleration

The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour.

*All people should practice **toleration** and live together in peace.*

tribulation

A state of great trouble or suffering.

*Life is full of **tribulations**.*
