## Associations of "Undetected" (30 Words)

<b>anonymous</b>	Having no known name or identity or known source. <i>An <b>anonymous</b> gift.</i>
<b><u>blind</u></b>	Make blind by putting the eyes out. <i>The injury temporarily <b>blinded</b> him.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>A compilation of <b>esoteric</b> philosophical theories.</i>
<b>inglorious</b>	(used of conduct or character) deserving or bringing disgrace or shame. <i><b>Inglorious</b> though the peasants may have been this is not synonymous with mute.</i>
<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i><b>Invisible</b> rays.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	Having no name or no known name. <i>A <b>nameless</b> yearning for transcendence.</i>
<b><u>neglect</u></b>	The trait of neglecting responsibilities and lacking concern. <i>The old churchyard has been sadly <b>neglected</b>.</i>
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The big elm tree <b>obscures</b> our view of the valley.</i>
<b><u>occult</u></b>	(of a celestial body) conceal (an apparently smaller body) from view by passing or being in front of it. <i><b>Occult</b> lore.</i>
<b>offstage</b>	(in a theatre) not taking place on the stage and so not visible to the audience. <i>Screams were heard <b>offstage</b>.</i>
<b>recondite</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some <b>recondite</b> problem in historiography.</i>
<b><u>remaining</u></b>	Still to happen; future. <i>They advertised for any <b>remaining</b> creditors to come forward.</i>

<b><u>shameful</u></b>	Giving offense to moral sensibilities and injurious to reputation. <i>The wicked rascally <b>shameful</b> conduct of the bankrupt.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>The train was an unexpected <b>sight</b>.</i>
<b>soundproof</b>	Preventing, or constructed of material that prevents, the passage of sound. <i>A <b>soundproof</b> windowless room.</i>
<b><u>survivor</u></b>	The remainder of a group of people or things. <i>She is a born <b>survivor</b>.</i>
<b><u>unappreciated</u></b>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b><u>unaware</u></b>	(often followed by `of') not aware. <i><b>Unaware</b> of the danger they were in.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Eluding diagnosis. <i>Some patients have diseases that go <b>undiagnosed</b> and therefore untreated.</i>
<b><u>undiscovered</u></b>	Not discovered. <i>The novel had lain <b>undiscovered</b> for years among his papers.</i>
<b><u>unfamiliar</u></b>	Unusual or uncharacteristic. <i>He felt a stranger among the crowd of <b>unfamiliar</b> faces.</i>
<b>unidentified</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>A picture of an <b>unidentified</b> motorcyclist.</i>
<b><u>unintentionally</u></b>	Not on purpose. <i>I may have <b>unintentionally</b> misled some of you.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>They came like angels out the <b>unknown</b>.</i>
<b><u>unnamed</u></b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An <b>unnamed</b> donor.</i>
<b><u>unnoticed</u></b>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went <b>unnoticed</b> by the referee.</i>
<b>unobserved</b>	Not observed. <i>Their courtship has not gone <b>unobserved</b> by Giles.</i>
<b><u>unseen</u></b>	An unseen passage for translation. <i><b>Unseen</b> forces at work.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Not celebrated or praised. <i>Harvey is one of the <b>unsung</b> heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
