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Associations of "Undetected" (30 Words)

anonymous	Having no known name or identity or known source. <i>An anonymous gift.</i>
<u>blind</u>	Make blind by putting the eyes out. <i>The injury temporarily blinded him.</i>
esoteric	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>A compilation of esoteric philosophical theories.</i>
inglorious	(used of conduct or character) deserving or bringing disgrace or shame. <i>Inglorious though the peasants may have been this is not synonymous with mute.</i>
<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>Invisible rays.</i>
nameless	Having no name or no known name. <i>A nameless yearning for transcendence.</i>
<u>neglect</u>	The trait of neglecting responsibilities and lacking concern. <i>The old churchyard has been sadly neglected.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The big elm tree obscures our view of the valley.</i>
<u>occult</u>	(of a celestial body) conceal (an apparently smaller body) from view by passing or being in front of it. <i>Occult lore.</i>
offstage	(in a theatre) not taking place on the stage and so not visible to the audience. <i>Screams were heard offstage.</i>
recondite	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some recondite problem in historiography.</i>
<u>remaining</u>	Still to happen; future. <i>They advertised for any remaining creditors to come forward.</i>

<u>shameful</u>	Giving offense to moral sensibilities and injurious to reputation. <i>The wicked rascally shameful conduct of the bankrupt.</i>
sight	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>The train was an unexpected sight.</i>
soundproof	Preventing, or constructed of material that prevents, the passage of sound. <i>A soundproof windowless room.</i>
<u>survivor</u>	The remainder of a group of people or things. <i>She is a born survivor.</i>
<u>unappreciated</u>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt unappreciated and undervalued.</i>
<u>unaware</u>	(often followed by `of') not aware. <i>Unaware of the danger they were in.</i>
undiagnosed	Eluding diagnosis. <i>Some patients have diseases that go undiagnosed and therefore untreated.</i>
<u>undiscovered</u>	Not discovered. <i>The novel had lain undiscovered for years among his papers.</i>
<u>unfamiliar</u>	Unusual or uncharacteristic. <i>He felt a stranger among the crowd of unfamiliar faces.</i>
unidentified	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>A picture of an unidentified motorcyclist.</i>
<u>unintentionally</u>	Not on purpose. <i>I may have unintentionally misled some of you.</i>
unknown	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>They came like angels out the unknown.</i>
<u>unnamed</u>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An unnamed donor.</i>
<u>unnoticed</u>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went unnoticed by the referee.</i>
unobserved	Not observed. <i>Their courtship has not gone unobserved by Giles.</i>
<u>unseen</u>	An unseen passage for translation. <i>Unseen forces at work.</i>
unsung	Not celebrated or praised. <i>Harvey is one of the unsung heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
