incessantly	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
<u>ongoing</u>	Continuing; still in progress. <i>Ongoing negotiations.</i>
persistent	Continually recurring to the mind- Claudia Cassidy. <i>Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
procedural	Relating to court practice and procedure as opposed to the principles of law. <i>There had been several procedural errors in dealing with the call.</i>
procedure	A process or series of acts especially of a practical or mechanical nature involved in a particular form of work. <i>The standard procedure for informing new employees about conditions of work.</i>
<u>proceed</u>	(of an action) carry on or continue. <i>His claim that all power proceeded from God.</i>

progress	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress. <i>I cannot predict how quickly we can progress the matter.</i>
progression	The act of moving forward (as toward a goal). <i>The vista unfolds in a progression of castles and vineyards as seemingly endless as the Rhine itself.</i>
progressively	Steadily; in stages. <i>Successive governments progressively increased expenditure on welfare.</i>
relentless	Unceasingly intense. <i>A patient but relentless taskmaster.</i>
resolute	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>He was resolute in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
steadfast	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>A steadfast ally.</i>
steady	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>I thought I d better get a steady job.</i>
step	Furnish with steps. <i>The government must take steps to discourage age discrimination.</i>
tenacious	Good at remembering. <i>A tenacious local legend.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unrelenting	Harsh. <i>The heat was unrelenting.</i>
unwavering	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i>Unwavering loyalty.</i>
