<b>expedite</b>	Process fast and efficiently. <i>He promised to <b>expedite</b> economic reforms.</i>
<b>expeditiously</b>	With speed and efficiency. <i>The directors will move <b>expeditiously</b> to reach a conclusion.</i>
<b>improvement</b>	A thing that makes something better or is better than something else. <i>Their <b>improvements</b> increased the value of the property.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>ongoing</b>	Continuing; still in progress. <i><b>Ongoing</b> negotiations.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continually recurring to the mind- Claudia Cassidy. <i><b>Persistent</b> leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
<b>procedural</b>	Relating to court practice and procedure as opposed to the principles of law. <i>There had been several <b>procedural</b> errors in dealing with the call.</i>
<b>procedure</b>	A process or series of acts especially of a practical or mechanical nature involved in a particular form of work. <i>The standard <b>procedure</b> for informing new employees about conditions of work.</i>
<b>proceed</b>	(of an action) carry on or continue. <i>His claim that all power <b>proceeded</b> from God.</i>

<b>progress</b>	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress. <i>I cannot predict how quickly we can <b>progress</b> the matter.</i>
<b>progression</b>	The act of moving forward (as toward a goal). <i>The vista unfolds in a <b>progression</b> of castles and vineyards as seemingly endless as the Rhine itself.</i>
<b>progressively</b>	Steadily; in stages. <i>Successive governments <b>progressively</b> increased expenditure on welfare.</i>
<b>relentless</b>	Unceasingly intense. <i>A patient but <b>relentless</b> taskmaster.</i>
<b>resolute</b>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>He was <b>resolute</b> in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>A <b>steadfast</b> ally.</i>
<b>steady</b>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>I thought I d better get a <b>steady</b> job.</i>
<b>step</b>	Furnish with steps. <i>The government must take <b>steps</b> to discourage age discrimination.</i>
<b>tenacious</b>	Good at remembering. <i>A <b>tenacious</b> local legend.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>unrelenting</b>	Harsh. <i>The heat was <b>unrelenting</b>.</i>
<b>unwavering</b>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i><b>Unwavering</b> loyalty.</i>
