## Synonyms of "Undiscovered" as an adjective (6 Words)

- dormant** (of a volcano) temporarily inactive.  
*The successful consortium included a **dormant** company.*
- inactive** Not participating in a chemical reaction; chemically inert.  
*An **inactive** Russian spy.*
- quiescent** (pathology) causing no symptoms.  
*The **quiescent** melancholy of the town.*
- unexplored** Not yet discovered.  
*The research focuses on an **unexplored** theme in European history.*
- untapped** (of a resource) not yet exploited or used.  
*The vast **untapped** potential of individual women and men.*

**unused** Not yet used or soiled.  
*Unused to spicy food she took a long mouthful of water.*

## Usage Examples of "Undiscovered" as an adjective

- *Undiscovered islands.*
- *The novel had lain undiscovered for years among his papers.*
- *With earth-based telescopes many stars remain undiscovered.*

## Associations of "Undiscovered" (30 Words)

<b>anonymous</b>	(of a person) not identified by name; of unknown name. <i>An <b>anonymous</b> gift.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest. <i>A compilation of <b>esoteric</b> philosophical theories.</i>
<b>inglorious</b>	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i><b>Inglorious</b> though the peasants may have been this is not synonymous with mute.</i>
<b>invisible</b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>This <b>invisible</b> gas is present to some extent in every home.</i>
<b>leftover</b>	Not used up. <i><b>Leftover</b> meatloaf.</i>
<b>lifeboat</b>	A small boat kept on a ship for use in emergency, typically one of a number on deck or suspended from davits.
<b>nameless</b>	Too horrific to be described. <i>His grandfather had been a <b>nameless</b> parentless child.</i>
<b>obscure</b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The stars are <b>obscured</b> by the clouds.</i>
<b>occult</b>	Cause an eclipse of (a celestial body) by intervention. <i><b>Occult</b> blood in the stool.</i>
<b>offstage</b>	A stage area out of sight of the audience. <i><b>Offstage</b> political meetings.</i>
<b>recondite</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some <b>recondite</b> problem in historiography.</i>
<b>remaining</b>	Still existing, present, or in use; surviving. <i>Lilly was my last <b>remaining</b> close relative.</i>

<b><u>shameful</u></b>	Worthy of or causing shame or disgrace. <i>A <b>shameful</b> display of cowardice.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun. <i>Out of <b>sight</b> of land.</i>
<b>soundproof</b>	Preventing, or constructed of material that prevents, the passage of sound. <i>A sheet of <b>soundproof</b> glass.</i>
<b><u>survivor</u></b>	A person who copes well with difficulties in their life. <i>The <b>survivors</b> of the fire were taken to a hospital.</i>
<b><u>unappreciated</u></b>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b><u>unaware</u></b>	Not aware. <i><b>Unaware</b> of the danger they were in.</i>
<b><u>undetected</u></b>	Not detected or discovered. <i>The thieves escaped <b>undetected</b>.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Eluding diagnosis. <i><b>Undiagnosed</b> disease.</i>
<b><u>unfamiliar</u></b>	Not known or well known. <i>A name <b>unfamiliar</b> to most.</i>
<b>unidentified</b>	Not yet identified. <i>An <b>unidentified</b> species.</i>
<b><u>unintentionally</u></b>	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. <i><b>Unintentionally</b> rude song lyrics.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>They came like angels out the <b>unknown</b>.</i>
<b><u>unnamed</u></b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An <b>unnamed</b> donor.</i>
<b><u>unnoticed</u></b>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went <b>unnoticed</b> by the referee.</i>
<b>unobserved</b>	Not seen or observed. <i>Managed to slip away <b>unobserved</b>.</i>
<b><u>unseen</u></b>	An unseen passage for translation. <i><b>Unseen</b> forces at work.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Harvey is one of the <b>unsung</b> heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
