Synonyms of "Undiscovered" as an adjective (6 Words)

- dormant** (of a volcano) temporarily inactive.
*The successful consortium included a **dormant** company.*
- inactive** Not participating in a chemical reaction; chemically inert.
*An **inactive** Russian spy.*
- quiescent** (pathology) causing no symptoms.
*The **quiescent** melancholy of the town.*
- unexplored** Not yet discovered.
*The research focuses on an **unexplored** theme in European history.*
- untapped** (of a resource) not yet exploited or used.
*The vast **untapped** potential of individual women and men.*

unused Not yet used or soiled.
Unused to spicy food she took a long mouthful of water.

Usage Examples of "Undiscovered" as an adjective

- *Undiscovered islands.*
- *The novel had lain undiscovered for years among his papers.*
- *With earth-based telescopes many stars remain undiscovered.*

Associations of "Undiscovered" (30 Words)

anonymous	(of a person) not identified by name; of unknown name. <i>An anonymous gift.</i>
esoteric	Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest. <i>A compilation of esoteric philosophical theories.</i>
inglorious	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i>Inglorious though the peasants may have been this is not synonymous with mute.</i>
invisible	Invisible exports and imports. <i>This invisible gas is present to some extent in every home.</i>
leftover	Not used up. <i>Leftover meatloaf.</i>
lifeboat	A small boat kept on a ship for use in emergency, typically one of a number on deck or suspended from davits.
nameless	Too horrific to be described. <i>His grandfather had been a nameless parentless child.</i>
obscure	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The stars are obscured by the clouds.</i>
occult	Cause an eclipse of (a celestial body) by intervention. <i>Occult blood in the stool.</i>
offstage	A stage area out of sight of the audience. <i>Offstage political meetings.</i>
recondite	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some recondite problem in historiography.</i>
remaining	Still existing, present, or in use; surviving. <i>Lilly was my last remaining close relative.</i>

<u>shameful</u>	Worthy of or causing shame or disgrace. <i>A shameful display of cowardice.</i>
sight	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun. <i>Out of sight of land.</i>
soundproof	Preventing, or constructed of material that prevents, the passage of sound. <i>A sheet of soundproof glass.</i>
<u>survivor</u>	A person who copes well with difficulties in their life. <i>The survivors of the fire were taken to a hospital.</i>
<u>unappreciated</u>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt unappreciated and undervalued.</i>
<u>unaware</u>	Not aware. <i>Unaware of the danger they were in.</i>
<u>undetected</u>	Not detected or discovered. <i>The thieves escaped undetected.</i>
undiagnosed	Eluding diagnosis. <i>Undiagnosed disease.</i>
<u>unfamiliar</u>	Not known or well known. <i>A name unfamiliar to most.</i>
unidentified	Not yet identified. <i>An unidentified species.</i>
<u>unintentionally</u>	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. <i>Unintentionally rude song lyrics.</i>
unknown	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>They came like angels out the unknown.</i>
<u>unnamed</u>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An unnamed donor.</i>
<u>unnoticed</u>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went unnoticed by the referee.</i>
unobserved	Not seen or observed. <i>Managed to slip away unobserved.</i>
<u>unseen</u>	An unseen passage for translation. <i>Unseen forces at work.</i>
unsung	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Harvey is one of the unsung heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
