- *Not disputed or called in question; accepted.*
- *Generally agreed upon; not subject to dispute.*

### Synonyms of "Undisputed" as an adjective (27 Words)

<a href="#">absolute</a>	(of an adjective) used without an expressed noun (e.g. the brave). <b><i>Absolute</i></b> freedom.
<b>accepted</b>	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>The <b>accepted</b> consensus within the church.</i>
<b>acknowledged</b>	Admitted or accepted as true, valid, or legitimate. <i>A woman of <b>acknowledged</b> accomplishments.</i>
<a href="#">certain</a>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>A <b>certain</b> General Percy captured the town.</i>

<u>clear</u>	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>I have <b>clear</b> title to this property.</i>
clear-cut	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind.
confirmed	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>Received <b>confirmed</b> reports of casualties.</i>
decided	(of a quality) definite; unquestionable. <i>At a distinct or <b>decided</b> disadvantage.</i>
<u>definite</u>	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>It is <b>definite</b> that they have won.</i>
incontestable	Not open to question; obviously true.
incontrovertible	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i><b>Incontrovertible</b> proof.</i>
indubitable	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
irrefutable	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>An <b>irrefutable</b> argument.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
not in doubt	Holding office.
not in question	Currently fashionable.
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>He is HIV <b>positive</b>.</i>
recognized	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>His <b>recognized</b> superiority in this kind of work.</i>
<u>sure</u>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>What is <b>sure</b> is that learning is a complex business.</i>
unchallenged	Not disputed or questioned. <i>The report s findings did not go <b>unchallenged</b>.</i>
uncontested	Not contested. <i>These claims have not gone <b>uncontested</b>.</i>
<u>undeniable</u>	Not possible to deny. <i>It is an <b>undeniable</b> fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.</i>
undoubted	Not questioned or doubted by anyone. <i>Her <b>undoubted</b> ability.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>An <b>unequivocal</b> or univocal statement.</i>

**unmistakable**

Clearly evident to the mind.

*His opposition to slavery was **unmistakable**.*

**unquestionable**

Not able to be disputed or doubted.

*An **unquestionable** antique.*

**unquestioned**

Not subjected to questioning.

*His loyalty to John is **unquestioned**.*
