- *Not disputed or called in question; accepted.*
- *Generally agreed upon; not subject to dispute.*

Synonyms of "Undisputed" as an adjective (27 Words)

absolute	(of an adjective) used without an expressed noun (e.g. the brave). <i>Absolute</i> freedom.
accepted	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>The accepted consensus within the church.</i>
acknowledged	Admitted or accepted as true, valid, or legitimate. <i>A woman of acknowledged accomplishments.</i>
certain	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>A certain General Percy captured the town.</i>

clear	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>I have clear title to this property.</i>
clear-cut	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind.
confirmed	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>Received confirmed reports of casualties.</i>
decided	(of a quality) definite; unquestionable. <i>At a distinct or decided disadvantage.</i>
definite	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>It is definite that they have won.</i>
incontestable	Not open to question; obviously true.
incontrovertible	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>Incontrovertible proof.</i>
indubitable	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
irrefutable	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>An irrefutable argument.</i>
manifest	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
not in doubt	Holding office.
not in question	Currently fashionable.
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>He is HIV positive.</i>
recognized	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>His recognized superiority in this kind of work.</i>
sure	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>What is sure is that learning is a complex business.</i>
unchallenged	Not disputed or questioned. <i>The report's findings did not go unchallenged.</i>
uncontested	Not contested. <i>These claims have not gone uncontested.</i>
undeniable	Not possible to deny. <i>It is an undeniable fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.</i>
undoubted	Not questioned or doubted by anyone. <i>Her undoubted ability.</i>
unequivocal	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>An unequivocal or univocal statement.</i>

<u>unmistakable</u>	Clearly evident to the mind. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
<u>unquestionable</u>	Not able to be disputed or doubted. <i>An unquestionable antique.</i>
unquestioned	Not subjected to questioning. <i>His loyalty to John is unquestioned.</i>
