- balmy** Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
*It used to drive my husband **balmy**.*
- halcyon** Marked by peace and prosperity.
*The **halcyon** days of the clipper trade.*
- pacific** Relating to or bordering the Pacific Ocean.
*A **pacific** gesture.*
- peaceful** Peacefully resistant in response to injustice.
*His **peaceful** mood vanished.*
- quiet** Of the sun characterized by a low level of surface phenomena like sunspots
e.g.
*I ll have a **quiet** word with him.*
- relaxed** (of a muscle or other body part) not tense.
*We were having a great time and feeling very **relaxed**.*

<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and restful.</i>
<u>serene</u>	Completely clear and fine. <i>Her eyes were closed and she looked very serene.</i>
still	(of a drink) not effervescent. <i>The sheriff commanded him to stand still and drop the gun.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>A lake of tranquil blue water reflecting a tranquil blue sky.</i>
unagitated	Not agitated; without losing self-possession.
<u>unbothered</u>	Not worried or concerned. <i>She was unbothered by the mess in the sink.</i>
unflustered	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension. <i>She seemed surprisingly unflustered by the delay.</i>
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Her opponents were unmoved and plan to return to court.</i>
unperturbed	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension- Anthony Trollope. <i>Kenneth seems unperturbed by the news.</i>
unruffled	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The unruffled waters of the lake.</i>
untroubled	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. <i>Untroubled sleep.</i>
windless	Without or almost without wind. <i>He prefers windless days for playing golf.</i>



Usage Examples of "Undisturbed" as an adjective

- *He could pursue his studies undisturbed.*
- *The tombs had lain undisturbed for 2,500 years.*
- *A quiet weekend of undisturbed tranquility.*

<u>divine</u>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Paintings of shipwrecks being prevented by divine intervention.</i>
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>An easy good natured manner.</i>
godly	Emanating from God-Saturday Review. <i>How to live the godly life.</i>
halcyon	(Greek mythology) a woman who was turned into a kingfisher. <i>A halcyon atmosphere.</i>
hallowed	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>Jerusalem s hallowed soil.</i>
happy-go-lucky	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
<u>heavenly</u>	Of or belonging to heaven or god. <i>Heavenly Father.</i>
insouciant	Showing a casual lack of concern. <i>An elegantly insouciant manner.</i>
inviolable	Must be kept sacred. <i>An inviolable rule of chastity.</i>
<u>leisurely</u>	In an unhurried way or at one's convenience. <i>At a leisurely or easygoing pace.</i>
<u>nonchalant</u>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>Drove his car with nonchalant abandon.</i>
<u>pilgrimage</u>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>Now is the thirty first year of my dark pilgrimage on this earth.</i>
possession	The act of having and controlling property. <i>He remains in full possession of his sanity.</i>
relaxed	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>Gave the impression of being quite relaxed.</i>

sacred	Regarded as too valuable to be interfered with; sacrosanct. <i>The sacred mosque.</i>
saintly	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
shrine	Enshrine. <i>Her grave has become a shrine for fans from all over the world.</i>
supernal	Of exceptional quality or extent. <i>Supernal erudition.</i>
unconcerned	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. <i>The average American is unconcerned that his or her plight is the result of a complex of personal and economic and governmental actions beyond the normal citizen s comprehension and control.</i>
unmolested	Not pestered or molested; left in peace. <i>They allowed him to pass unmolested.</i>
untroubled	Free from turmoil or worries. <i>Seemed untroubled by doubts of any kind.</i>
