unbothered Not worried or concerned.

She was unbothered by the mess in the sink.

unflustered Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension.

She seemed surprisingly **unflustered** by the delay.

unmoved Emotionally unmoved.

Her opponents were **unmoved** and plan to return to court.

unperturbed Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension- Anthony Trollope.

Kenneth seems **unperturbed** by the news.

unruffled Free from disturbance by heavy waves.

The **unruffled** waters of the lake.

untroubled Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind.

Untroubled sleep.

windless Without or almost without wind.

He prefers **windless** days for playing golf.
