- balmy** Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.  
*It used to drive my husband **balmy**.*
- halcyon** Marked by peace and prosperity.  
*The **halcyon** days of the clipper trade.*
- pacific** Relating to or bordering the Pacific Ocean.  
*A **pacific** gesture.*
- peaceful** Peacefully resistant in response to injustice.  
*His **peaceful** mood vanished.*
- quiet** Of the sun characterized by a low level of surface phenomena like sunspots  
e.g.  
*I ll have a **quiet** word with him.*
- relaxed** (of a muscle or other body part) not tense.  
*We were having a great time and feeling very **relaxed**.*

<b><u>restful</u></b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and <b>restful</b>.</i>
<b><u>serene</u></b>	Completely clear and fine. <i>Her eyes were closed and she looked very <b>serene</b>.</i>
<b>still</b>	(of a drink) not effervescent. <i>The sheriff commanded him to stand <b>still</b> and drop the gun.</i>
<b><u>tranquil</u></b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>A lake of <b>tranquil</b> blue water reflecting a <b>tranquil</b> blue sky.</i>
<b>unagitated</b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession.
<b><u>unbothered</u></b>	Not worried or concerned. <i>She was <b>unbothered</b> by the mess in the sink.</i>
<b>unflustered</b>	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension. <i>She seemed surprisingly <b>unflustered</b> by the delay.</i>
<b>unmoved</b>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Her opponents were <b>unmoved</b> and plan to return to court.</i>
<b>unperturbed</b>	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension- Anthony Trollope. <i>Kenneth seems <b>unperturbed</b> by the news.</i>
<b>unruffled</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The <b>unruffled</b> waters of the lake.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. <i><b>Untroubled</b> sleep.</i>
<b>windless</b>	Without or almost without wind. <i>He prefers <b>windless</b> days for playing golf.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Undisturbed" as an adjective

- *He could pursue his studies undisturbed.*
- *The tombs had lain undisturbed for 2,500 years.*
- *A quiet weekend of undisturbed tranquility.*

<b>angelic</b>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>Angelic beneficence.</i>
<b>beatific</b>	Imparting holy bliss. <i>A <b>beatific</b> smile.</i>
<b>blessed</b>	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>Our <b>blessed</b> land.</i>
<b>calm</b>	Become quiet or calm especially after a state of agitation. <i>His usual <b>calm</b> deserted him.</i>
<b>carefree</b>	Free of trouble and worry and care. <i>We were young and <b>carefree</b>.</i>

<b><u>casual</u></b>	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. <i>Casual employment.</i>
<b>cool</b>	Great coolness and composure under strain. <i>A <b>cool</b> autumn day.</i>
<b><u>creator</u></b>	Used as a name for God. <i>Water the <b>creator</b> of climate and weather.</i>
<b><u>devout</u></b>	Totally committed to a cause or belief. <i>The most <b>devout</b> environmentalist.</i>
<b><u>divine</u></b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Paintings of shipwrecks being prevented by <b>divine</b> intervention.</i>
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>An <b>easy</b> good natured manner.</i>
<b>godly</b>	Emanating from God-Saturday Review. <i>How to live the <b>godly</b> life.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	(Greek mythology) a woman who was turned into a kingfisher. <i>A <b>halcyon</b> atmosphere.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>Jerusalem s <b>hallowed</b> soil.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
<b><u>heavenly</u></b>	Of or belonging to heaven or god. <i><b>Heavenly</b> Father.</i>
<b>insouciant</b>	Showing a casual lack of concern. <i>An elegantly <b>insouciant</b> manner.</i>
<b>inviolable</b>	Must be kept sacred. <i>An <b>inviolable</b> rule of chastity.</i>
<b><u>leisurely</u></b>	In an unhurried way or at one's convenience. <i>At a <b>leisurely</b> or easygoing pace.</i>
<b><u>nonchalant</u></b>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>Drove his car with <b>nonchalant</b> abandon.</i>
<b><u>pilgrimage</u></b>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>Now is the thirty first year of my dark <b>pilgrimage</b> on this earth.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The act of having and controlling property. <i>He remains in full <b>possession</b> of his sanity.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>Gave the impression of being quite <b>relaxed</b>.</i>



<b>sacred</b>	Regarded as too valuable to be interfered with; sacrosanct. <i>The <b>sacred</b> mosque.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A truly <b>saintly</b> woman.</i>
<b>shrine</b>	Enshrine. <i>Her grave has become a <b>shrine</b> for fans from all over the world.</i>
<b>supernal</b>	Of exceptional quality or extent. <i><b>Supernal</b> erudition.</i>
<b>unconcerned</b>	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. <i>The average American is <b>unconcerned</b> that his or her plight is the result of a complex of personal and economic and governmental actions beyond the normal citizen s comprehension and control.</i>
<b>unmolested</b>	Not pestered or molested; left in peace. <i>They allowed him to pass <b>unmolested</b>.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Free from turmoil or worries. <i>Seemed <b>untroubled</b> by doubts of any kind.</i>
