## Undivided as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Undivided" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “undivided” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not parted by conflict of opinion.*
- *Not divided among or brought to bear on more than one object or objective.*
- *Not separated into parts or shares; constituting an undivided unit.*
- *Not shared by or among others.*
- *Devoted completely to one object.*
- *Not divided, separated, or broken into parts.*

### Synonyms of "Undivided" as an adjective (24 Words)

<b><a href="#">absolute</a></b>	Complete and without restriction or qualification; sometimes used informally as intensifiers. <b><i>Absolute</i></b> truth.
<b>complete</b>	Perfect and complete in every respect having all necessary qualities. A <b><i>complete</i></b> gentleman.

<b>concentrated</b>	Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature unable to dissolve still more of a substance. <i>His <b>concentrated</b> attention.</i>
<u><b>consistent</b></u>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>He is their most <b>consistent</b> player this season.</i>
<b>consummate</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>A <b>consummate</b> performance.</i>
<b>dedicated</b>	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high or sacred purpose. <i>A <b>dedicated</b> dancer.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged Bacon. <i>An <b>entire</b> town devastated by an earthquake.</i>
<u><b>exclusive</b></u>	Not including. <i>Prices are <b>exclusive</b> of VAT.</i>
<b>full</b>	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>She just ate till she was <b>full</b> up.</i>
<b>out-and-out</b>	Directed outward or serving to direct something outward.
<u><b>sincere</b></u>	Open and genuine; not deceitful. <i>A painfully <b>sincere</b> young actor.</i>
<u><b>single</b></u>	Being or characteristic of a single thing or person. <i>A <b>single</b> survivor.</i>
<u><b>solid</b></u>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i><b>Solid</b> blackness.</i>
<u><b>thorough</b></u>	Absolute (used to emphasize the degree of something, typically something unwelcome or unpleasant). <i>Planners need a <b>thorough</b> understanding of the subject.</i>
<u><b>total</b></u>	Complete; absolute. <i>A <b>total</b> cost of 4 000.</i>
<u><b>unadulterated</b></u>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i><b>Unadulterated</b> whole milk yogurt.</i>
<b>unalloyed</b>	(of metal) not alloyed; pure. <i><b>Unalloyed</b> pleasure.</i>
<u><b>unbroken</b></u>	Marked by continuous or uninterrupted extension in space or time or sequence. <i>An <b>unbroken</b> glass.</i>
<u><b>unmitigated</b></u>	Absolute; unqualified. <i>An <b>unmitigated</b> lie.</i>

<b>unqualified</b>	Having no right or entitlement. <i>The experiment was not an <b>unqualified</b> success.</i>
<b>unreserved</b>	Not set apart for a particular purpose or booked in advance. <i>He has had their <b>unreserved</b> support.</i>
<b>unshared</b>	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.</i>
<b>whole</b>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>Disputes on a <b>whole</b> range of issues.</i>
<b>wholehearted</b>	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. <i><b>Wholehearted</b> commitment.</i>
