Definitions of "Undivided" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “undivided” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not parted by conflict of opinion.*
- *Not divided among or brought to bear on more than one object or objective.*
- *Not separated into parts or shares; constituting an undivided unit.*
- *Not shared by or among others.*
- *Devoted completely to one object.*
- *Not divided, separated, or broken into parts.*

Synonyms of "Undivided" as an adjective (24 Words)

absolute	Complete and without restriction or qualification; sometimes used informally as intensifiers. <i>Absolute</i> truth.
complete	Perfect and complete in every respect having all necessary qualities. A <i>complete</i> gentleman.

concentrated	Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature unable to dissolve still more of a substance. <i>His concentrated attention.</i>
consistent	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>He is their most consistent player this season.</i>
consummate	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>A consummate performance.</i>
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high or sacred purpose. <i>A dedicated dancer.</i>
entire	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged Bacon. <i>An entire town devastated by an earthquake.</i>
exclusive	Not including. <i>Prices are exclusive of VAT.</i>
full	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>She just ate till she was full up.</i>
out-and-out	Directed outward or serving to direct something outward.
sincere	Open and genuine; not deceitful. <i>A painfully sincere young actor.</i>
single	Being or characteristic of a single thing or person. <i>A single survivor.</i>
solid	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>Solid blackness.</i>
thorough	Absolute (used to emphasize the degree of something, typically something unwelcome or unpleasant). <i>Planners need a thorough understanding of the subject.</i>
total	Complete; absolute. <i>A total cost of 4 000.</i>
unadulterated	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Unadulterated whole milk yogurt.</i>
unalloyed	(of metal) not alloyed; pure. <i>Unalloyed pleasure.</i>
unbroken	Marked by continuous or uninterrupted extension in space or time or sequence. <i>An unbroken glass.</i>
unmitigated	Absolute; unqualified. <i>An unmitigated lie.</i>

unqualified	Having no right or entitlement. <i>The experiment was not an unqualified success.</i>
unreserved	Not set apart for a particular purpose or booked in advance. <i>He has had their unreserved support.</i>
unshared	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer unshared independent accommodation.</i>
whole	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>Disputes on a whole range of issues.</i>
wholehearted	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. <i>Wholehearted commitment.</i>
