• They are undoubtedly guilty.

With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally.

absolutely White collar crime increased both **absolutely** and in comparison with

other categories.

Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so.

The committee investigated some **apparent** discrepancies.

From appearances alone.

She has **apparently** been living here for some time.

assured Protected against discontinuance or change.

An extremely **assured** performance.

Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true.

The lad kept his cool and **assuredly** slipped the ball between the posts.

Definitely or positively (`sure' is sometimes used informally for `surely.

Our current revenues are **certainly** lower than anticipated.

The quality of being reliably true.

The passing of the act made a general election a **certainty**.

A clear or unobstructed space or expanse of land or water.

We ll go out if the weather **clears**.

clearly In a clear manner; with clarity.

Her ability to write **clearly**.

decidedly Undoubtedly; undeniably.

He looked **decidedly** uncomfortable.

decisivelyWith finality; conclusively.

We must respond **decisively** to protect our national interests.

definite (of a person) certain or sure about something.

A **definite** drop in attendance.

Without doubt (used for emphasis.

definitely We couldn t plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more

definitely.

Doubtless you ll solve the problem.

Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly. evidently

She was in bed and **evidently** in great pain.

Explicitly; clearly. expressly

She was **expressly** forbidden to use the stove.

Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. indubitable

An **indubitable** truth.

In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. indubitably

Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.

Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. justified

The doctors were **justified** in treating her.

Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. obvious

Obvious errors.

In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. obviously

Obviously everyone has to do what they think is right.

In accordance with justice or what is morally right. rightly

If I remember **rightly** she never gives interviews.

So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. seemingly

A **seemingly** competent and well organized person.

Give a guarantee or promise of. stipulate

They **stipulate**d to release all the prisoners.

Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. sure

I m **sure** I ve seen that dress before.

Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. surely

If he did not heed the warning he would **surely** die.

Used to emphasize emotional sincerity or seriousness. truly

He speaks **truly**.

Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. unambiguous

Instructions should be **unambiguous**.

Clearly defined or formulated-R.B.Taney.

unequivocal The plain and **unequivocal** language of the laws.

Without question. unquestionably

Unquestionably the loss of his father was a grievous blow.
