Definitions of "Undoubtedly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “undoubtedly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without doubt; certainly.*

Synonyms of "Undoubtedly" as an adverb (7 Words)

beyond a doubt	In addition.
beyond doubt	In addition.
beyond the shadow of a doubt	Farther along in space or time or degree.
doubtless	Without doubt; certainly. <i>The company would doubtless find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>
doubtlessly	Certainly; without doubt. <i>You ve doubtlessly heard me ramble on about the importance of culture.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.</i>

no doubt Not in any degree or manner; not at all.

Usage Examples of "Undoubtedly" as an adverb

- *It's undoubtedly very beautiful.*
- *They are undoubtedly guilty.*

Associations of "Undoubtedly" (30 Words)

absolutely	With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally. <i>White collar crime increased both absolutely and in comparison with other categories.</i>
apparent	Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <i>The committee investigated some apparent discrepancies.</i>
apparently	From appearances alone. <i>She has apparently been living here for some time.</i>
assured	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>An extremely assured performance.</i>
assuredly	Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true. <i>The lad kept his cool and assuredly slipped the ball between the posts.</i>
certainly	Definitely or positively ('sure' is sometimes used informally for 'surely'). <i>Our current revenues are certainly lower than anticipated.</i>
certainty	The quality of being reliably true. <i>The passing of the act made a general election a certainty.</i>
clear	A clear or unobstructed space or expanse of land or water. <i>We'll go out if the weather clears.</i>
clearly	In a clear manner; with clarity. <i>Her ability to write clearly.</i>
decidedly	Undoubtedly; undeniably. <i>He looked decidedly uncomfortable.</i>
decisively	With finality; conclusively. <i>We must respond decisively to protect our national interests.</i>
definite	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>A definite drop in attendance.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more definitely.</i>

doubtless	Without doubt; certainly. <i>Doubtless you ll solve the problem.</i>
evidently	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>She was in bed and evidently in great pain.</i>
expressly	Explicitly; clearly. <i>She was expressly forbidden to use the stove.</i>
indubitable	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
justified	Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. <i>The doctors were justified in treating her.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
obviously	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>Obviously everyone has to do what they think is right.</i>
rightly	In accordance with justice or what is morally right. <i>If I remember rightly she never gives interviews.</i>
seemingly	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. <i>A seemingly competent and well organized person.</i>
stipulate	Give a guarantee or promise of. <i>They stipulated to release all the prisoners.</i>
sure	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>I m sure I ve seen that dress before.</i>
surely	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If he did not heed the warning he would surely die.</i>
truly	Used to emphasize emotional sincerity or seriousness. <i>He speaks truly.</i>
unambiguous	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>Instructions should be unambiguous.</i>
unequivocal	Clearly defined or formulated- R.B.Taney. <i>The plain and unequivocal language of the laws.</i>
unquestionably	Without question. <i>Unquestionably the loss of his father was a grievous blow.</i>
