## Associations of "Unduly definition" (30 Words)

<b><u>clarification</u></b>	An interpretation that removes obstacles to understanding. <i>The professor s <b>clarification</b> helped her to understand the textbook.</i>
<b><u>clarify</u></b>	Make clear and (more) comprehensible. <i><b>Clarify</b> the mystery surrounding her death.</i>
<b>define</b>	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>The contract will seek to <b>define</b> the client s obligations.</i>
<b><u>depict</u></b>	Represent by a drawing, painting, or other art form. <i>These equations may be <b>depicted</b> on a graph.</i>
<b><u>depiction</u></b>	A representation by picture or portraiture. <i>Michelangelo s <b>depictions</b> of the male nude.</i>
<b>describe</b>	To give an account or representation of in words. <i>The man was <b>described</b> as tall clean shaven and with short dark hair.</i>
<b><u>descriptive</u></b>	Describing or classifying in an objective and non-judgemental way. <i>The text contains some good <b>descriptive</b> passages.</i>
<b>dictionary</b>	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The <b>dictionary</b> definition of smile.</i>
<b>differentia</b>	An attribute that distinguishes a species of thing from other species of the same genus.
<b>disambiguate</b>	Remove uncertainty of meaning from (an ambiguous sentence, phrase, or other linguistic unit). <i>Word senses can be <b>disambiguated</b> by examining the context.</i>
<b><u>elucidate</u></b>	Make (something) clear; explain. <i>Work such as theirs will help to <b>elucidate</b> this matter.</i>
<b>enlighten</b>	Give (someone) greater knowledge and understanding about a subject or situation. <i>Christopher had not <b>enlightened</b> Francis as to their relationship.</i>

<b>example</b>	An occurrence of something. <i>A workbook and a data set will enable the researcher to follow worked <b>examples</b>.</i>
<b>expatiate</b>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She <b>expatiated</b> on working class novelists.</i>
<b>explain</b>	Give a reason so as to justify or excuse (an action or event). <i>He <b>explained</b> the situation.</i>
<b>explanation</b>	Thought that makes something comprehensible. <i>The <b>explanation</b> was very simple.</i>
<b>explicate</b>	Analyse (a literary work) in order to reveal its meaning. <i>These essays seek to <b>explicate</b> and contextualize Kristeva's writings.</i>
<b>explicit</b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i><b>Explicit</b> sexual scenes.</i>
<b>exposition</b>	(music) the section of a movement (especially in sonata form) where the major musical themes first occur. <i>The country squires dreaded the <b>exposition</b> of their rustic conversation.</i>
<b>expository</b>	Serving to expound or set forth. <i>An <b>expository</b> prologue.</i>
<b>expound</b>	State. <i>He declined to <b>expound</b> on his decision.</i>
<b>instruction</b>	A direction or order. <i><b>Instruction</b> in the Roman Catholic faith.</i>
<b>instructions</b>	A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it.
<b>interpret</b>	Give an interpretation or rendition of. <i>Can you <b>interpret</b> the speech of the visiting dignitaries.</i>
<b>interpretation</b>	An explanation of something that is not immediately obvious. <i>His unique <b>interpretation</b> of the Liszt tunes.</i>
<b>mean</b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>In a <b>mean</b> mood.</i>
<b>narrative</b>	The narrated part of a literary work, as distinct from dialogue. <i>His <b>narrative</b> was interesting.</i>
<b>rationale</b>	A set of reasons or a logical basis for a course of action or belief. <i>He explained the <b>rationale</b> behind the change.</i>
<b>signification</b>	The message that is intended or expressed or signified. <i>The <b>signification</b> of Chinese characters.</i>
