Associations of "Unduly definition" (30 Words)

<u>clarification</u>	An interpretation that removes obstacles to understanding. <i>The professor s clarification helped her to understand the textbook.</i>
<u>clarify</u>	Make clear and (more) comprehensible. <i>Clarify the mystery surrounding her death.</i>
define	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>The contract will seek to define the client s obligations.</i>
<u>depict</u>	Represent by a drawing, painting, or other art form. <i>These equations may be depicted on a graph.</i>
<u>depiction</u>	A representation by picture or portraiture. <i>Michelangelo s depictions of the male nude.</i>
describe	To give an account or representation of in words. <i>The man was described as tall clean shaven and with short dark hair.</i>
<u>descriptive</u>	Describing or classifying in an objective and non-judgemental way. <i>The text contains some good descriptive passages.</i>
dictionary	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The dictionary definition of smile.</i>
differentia	An attribute that distinguishes a species of thing from other species of the same genus.
disambiguate	Remove uncertainty of meaning from (an ambiguous sentence, phrase, or other linguistic unit). <i>Word senses can be disambiguated by examining the context.</i>
<u>elucidate</u>	Make (something) clear; explain. <i>Work such as theirs will help to elucidate this matter.</i>
enlighten	Give (someone) greater knowledge and understanding about a subject or situation. <i>Christopher had not enlightened Francis as to their relationship.</i>

example	An occurrence of something. <i>A workbook and a data set will enable the researcher to follow worked examples.</i>
expatiate	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She expatiated on working class novelists.</i>
explain	Give a reason so as to justify or excuse (an action or event). <i>He explained the situation.</i>
explanation	Thought that makes something comprehensible. <i>The explanation was very simple.</i>
explicate	Analyse (a literary work) in order to reveal its meaning. <i>These essays seek to explicate and contextualize Kristeva's writings.</i>
explicit	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Explicit sexual scenes.</i>
exposition	(music) the section of a movement (especially in sonata form) where the major musical themes first occur. <i>The country squires dreaded the exposition of their rustic conversation.</i>
expository	Serving to expound or set forth. <i>An expository prologue.</i>
expound	State. <i>He declined to expound on his decision.</i>
instruction	A direction or order. <i>Instruction in the Roman Catholic faith.</i>
instructions	A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it.
interpret	Give an interpretation or rendition of. <i>Can you interpret the speech of the visiting dignitaries.</i>
interpretation	An explanation of something that is not immediately obvious. <i>His unique interpretation of the Liszt tunes.</i>
mean	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>In a mean mood.</i>
narrative	The narrated part of a literary work, as distinct from dialogue. <i>His narrative was interesting.</i>
rationale	A set of reasons or a logical basis for a course of action or belief. <i>He explained the rationale behind the change.</i>
signification	The message that is intended or expressed or signified. <i>The signification of Chinese characters.</i>

specific

A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease.
