## Synonyms of "Undying" as an adjective (9 Words)

- abiding** (of a feeling or memory) lasting a long time; enduring.  
*An **abiding** belief.*
- constant** Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection.  
*A man **constant** in adherence to his ideals.*
- continuing** Of long duration.  
*A **continuing** controversy.*
- deathless** Living or lasting forever; immortal.  
*Pages of **deathless** prose.*
- enduring** Unceasing.  
*He formed a number of **enduring** relationships with women.*
- infinite** Limitless or endless in space, extent, or size; impossible to measure or calculate.  
*An **infinite** number of reasons.*
- lasting** Lasting a long time without change.  
*A **lasting** relationship.*
- perennial** (of a stream or spring) flowing throughout the year.  
***Perennial** manifestations of urban crisis.*

**permanent** Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place.  
*Literature of **permanent** value.*

## Associations of "Undying" (30 Words)

<b>ceaseless</b>	Constant and unending. <i>The fort was subjected to <b>ceaseless</b> bombardment.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>continually</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>This information is <b>continually</b> updated.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b>devotion</b>	Commitment to some purpose. <i>He returned to his <b>devotions</b>.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>An <b>endless</b> conversation.</i>
<b>eternal</b>	Used to emphasize expressions of admiration, gratitude, etc. <i><b>Eternal</b> truths of art and life.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Eternity. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>
<b>forever</b>	For a limitless time. <i>No one can live <b>forever</b>.</i>
<b>grinding</b>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>Crush it and add it to the honey with a <b>grinding</b> of pepper and salt.</i>
<b>immortal</b>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the <b>immortals</b> of soccer.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	The quality or state of being immortal. <i>Eating the fruit gave the gods <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>immortalize</b>	Confer enduring fame upon. <i>This melody <b>immortalized</b> its composer.</i>

<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>inexhaustible</b>	Incapable of being entirely consumed or used up. <i>His <b>inexhaustible</b> energy.</i>
<u><b>infinite</b></u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Intimations of the <b>infinite</b>.</i>
<u><b>infinity</b></u>	The state or quality of being infinite. <i>An <b>infinity</b> of combinations.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<u><b>permanent</b></u>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i>He s in a <b>permanent</b> state of rage.</i>
<b>permanently</b>	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>He is <b>permanently</b> disabled.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<u><b>perpetuity</b></u>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
<b>renewable</b>	(of a contract, agreement, etc.) capable of being renewed. <i>A shift away from fossil fuels to <b>renewable</b> energy.</i>
<u><b>timeless</b></u>	Unaffected by time. <i>Helen s <b>timeless</b> beauty.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s <b>unceasing</b> warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<u><b>unchecked</b></u>	Not examined or checked. <i>The broadcast was sloppy it was <b>unchecked</b> there was no investigation of the facts.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	(of a problem) having an infinite number of solutions. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
