
Undying as an Adjective

- Never dying.





Synonyms of "Undying" as an adjective (9 Words)

abiding	(of a feeling or memory) lasting a long time; enduring. An abiding belief.
constant	Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection. A man constant in adherence to his ideals.
continuing	Of long duration. A continuing controversy.
deathless	Living or lasting forever; immortal. Pages of deathless prose.
<u>enduring</u>	Unceasing. He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.
<u>infinite</u>	Limitless or endless in space, extent, or size; impossible to measure or calculate. An infinite number of reasons.
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. A lasting relationship.
<u>perennial</u>	(of a stream or spring) flowing throughout the year. Perennial manifestations of urban crisis.



permanent Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place. Literature of **permanent** value.

Usage Examples of "Undying" as an adjective

- His undying fame.
- Promises of undying love.

Associations of "Undying" (30 Words)

<u>ceaseless</u>	Constant and unending. The fort was subjected to ceaseless bombardment.
changeless	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i>Changeless truths</i> .
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. This information is continually updated.
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop continuously</i> .
<u>devotion</u>	Commitment to some purpose. <i>He returned to his devotions.</i>
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. An endless conversation.
<u>eternal</u>	Used to emphasize expressions of admiration, gratitude, etc. Eternal truths of art and life.
everlasting	Eternity. The damned would suffer everlasting torment.
<u>forever</u>	For a limitless time. No one can live forever .
<u>grinding</u>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. Crush it and add it to the honey with a grinding of pepper and salt.
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the immortals of soccer.</i>
immortality	The quality or state of being immortal. <i>Eating the fruit gave the gods immortality.</i>
immortalize	Confer enduring fame upon. This melody immortalize d its composer.



incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. The incessant beat of the music.
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. She talked about him incessantly .
inexhaustible	Incapable of being entirely consumed or used up. <i>His inexhaustible energy.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. Intimations of the infinite .
<u>infinity</u>	The state or quality of being infinite. An infinity of combinations.
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically. We got bogged down in interminable discussions.
<u>permanent</u>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i>He s in a permanent state of rage.</i>
permanently	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>He is permanently disabled.</i>
perpetual	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>
perpetually	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. She seems perpetually to have a mournful look on her face.
<u>perpetuity</u>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
renewable	(of a contract, agreement, etc.) capable of being renewed. A shift away from fossil fuels to renewable energy.
<u>timeless</u>	Unaffected by time. <i>Helen s timeless beauty.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
<u>unchecked</u>	Not examined or checked. The broadcast was sloppy it was unchecked there was no investigation of the facts.
unlimited	(of a problem) having an infinite number of solutions. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not</i> unlimited .
