Fear resulting from the awareness of danger. consternation To her **consternation** her car wouldn t start.

Concern and distress caused by something unexpected. dismay

To his **dismay** she left him.

The trait of seeming ill at ease. disquiet

Public **disquiet** about animal testing.

Extreme anxiety, sorrow, or pain. distress

To his **distress** he saw that she was trembling.

A person with dreadlocks.

dread Lyon combed his fingers through Curtis **dread**s.



fearfulness

An emotion experienced in anticipation of some specific pain or danger

(usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight.

fright A sudden intense feeling of fear.

I got the fright of my life seeing her in the hotel.

horror A thing causing a feeling of horror. **Horror**s two buttons were missing.

A general feeling of discomfort, illness, or unease whose exact cause is

malaise difficult to identify.

A society afflicted by a deep cultural **malaise**.

Sudden uncontrollable fear or anxiety, often causing wildly unthinking

panic behaviour.

Panic selling.

Terrorism.

terror
His delivery is the **terror** of even world class batsmen.

trepidation A feeling of fear or anxiety about something that may happen.

The men set off in fear and **trepidation**.

Embarrassment deriving from the feeling that others are critically aware of

uneasiness vou.

The media often express a general **uneasiness** with animal research.
