Synonyms of "Unease" as a noun (15 Words)

agitation	A state of agitation or turbulent change or development. <i>Widespread agitation for social reform.</i>
<u>alarm</u>	An alarm clock. The boat tilted and the boatmen cried out in alarm .
consternation	Fear resulting from the awareness of danger. <i>To her consternation her car wouldn t start.</i>
dismay	Concern and distress caused by something unexpected. <i>To his dismay she left him.</i>
disquiet	The trait of seeming ill at ease. Public disquiet about animal testing.
distress	Extreme anxiety, sorrow, or pain. To his distress he saw that she was trembling.
<u>dread</u>	A person with dreadlocks. Lyon combed his fingers through Curtis dread s.



fearfulness	An emotion experienced in anticipation of some specific pain or danger (usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight.
fright	A sudden intense feeling of fear. I got the fright of my life seeing her in the hotel.
horror	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>Horror</i> s two buttons were missing.
<u>malaise</u>	A general feeling of discomfort, illness, or unease whose exact cause is difficult to identify. A society afflicted by a deep cultural malaise .
<u>panic</u>	Sudden uncontrollable fear or anxiety, often causing wildly unthinking behaviour. Panic selling.
terror	Terrorism. His delivery is the terror of even world class batsmen.
trepidation	A feeling of fear or anxiety about something that may happen. The men set off in fear and trepidation .
uneasiness	Embarrassment deriving from the feeling that others are critically aware of you. The media often express a general uneasiness with animal research.
