Not friendly or forthcoming; cool and distant.  
*An **aloof** and somewhat austere figure.*

Showing little or no emotion or animation.  
*A woman who became active rather than **apathetic** as she grew older.*

<b>businesslike</b>	(of clothing, furniture, etc.) designed or appearing to be practical rather than decorative. <i>His brisk <b>businesslike</b> tone.</i>
<b>calm</b>	(of the weather) pleasantly free from wind. <i>The night was clear and <b>calm</b>.</i>
<b>clinical</b>	Relating to the observation and treatment of actual patients rather than theoretical or laboratory studies. <i>He spoke in the clipped <b>clinical</b> monotones typical of police testimony.</i>
<b>cold</b>	Extended meanings especially of psychological coldness without human warmth or emotion. <i>Elise was <b>cold</b> and barren.</i>
<b>collected</b>	In full control of your faculties. <i>The <b>collected</b> works of Milton.</i>
<b>composed</b>	Having one's feelings and expression under control; calm. <i>The performer seemed completely <b>composed</b> as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
<b>controlled</b>	Under the control of someone or something. <i>A sentence for possessing <b>controlled</b> substances.</i>
<b>cool</b>	Psychologically cool and unenthusiastic unfriendly or unresponsive or showing dislike. <i>He prided himself on keeping a <b>cool</b> head.</i>
<b>cool, calm, and collected</b>	Without exaggeration or qualification.
<b>detached</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>He is a <b>detached</b> observer of his own actions.</i>
<b>disinterested</b>	Having or feeling no interest in something; uninterested. <i>Her father was so <b>disinterested</b> in her progress that he only visited the school once.</i>
<b><u>distant</u></b>	Separate or apart in time. <i>His children found him strangely <b>distant</b>.</i>
<b>emotionless</b>	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>Her voice was flat and <b>emotionless</b>.</i>
<b>equable</b>	Not varying. <i>He could look sterner than his <b>equable</b> temperament would suggest.</i>
<b><u>frigid</u></b>	Sexually unresponsive. <i><b>Frigid</b> water.</i>

<b>impassive</b>	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>He remained <b>impassive</b> showing neither interest in nor concern for our plight.</i>
<b><u>impersonal</u></b>	Not influenced by, showing, or involving personal feelings. <i>The <b>impersonal</b> power of a government.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i><b>Indifferent</b> to her plea.</i>
<b>level-headed</b>	Exercising or showing good judgment.
<b>passionless</b>	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>The voice is <b>passionless</b> monotone.</i>
<b>phlegmatic</b>	Showing little emotion. <i>The <b>phlegmatic</b> British character.</i>
<b>rational</b>	Based on or in accordance with reason or logic. <i><b>Rational</b> numbers.</i>
<b><u>remote</u></b>	(of an electronic device) operating or operated at a distance by means of radio or infrared signals. <i>A <b>remote</b> contingency.</i>
<b><u>reserved</u></b>	Marked by self-restraint and reticence-Victoria Sackville-West. <i>A <b>reserved</b> seat.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	Held in place (used especially of a person in a vehicle secured by a seat belt). <i>The drawings with their <b>restrained</b> colours give a feeling of peace and contemplation.</i>
<b><u>reticent</u></b>	Reluctant to draw attention to yourself. <i>She was extremely <b>reticent</b> about her personal affairs.</i>
<b><u>serene</u></b>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>A <b>serene</b> expression on her face.</i>
<b><u>sober</u></b>	Serious, sensible, and solemn. <i>A <b>sober</b> grey suit.</i>
<b>stoical</b>	Enduring pain and hardship without showing one's feelings or complaining. <i>He taught a <b>stoical</b> acceptance of suffering.</i>
<b><u>tranquil</u></b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>The sea was <b>tranquil</b>.</i>
<b>unagitated</b>	Not physically disturbed or set in motion.

<b><u>unconcerned</u></b>	Not occupied or engaged with. <i>The average American is <b>unconcerned</b> that his or her plight is the result of a complex of personal and economic and governmental actions beyond the normal citizen's comprehension and control.</i>
<b>undemonstrative</b>	Not given to open expression of emotion. <i>The English are an <b>undemonstrative</b> lot.</i>
<b>unexcitable</b>	Not easily excited. <i>An <b>unexcitable</b> temperament.</i>
<b>unfeeling</b>	Devoid of feeling for others. <i>He lowered his numb <b>unfeeling</b> body into a seat and closed his eyes.</i>
<b>unmoved</b>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>He was clearly <b>unmoved</b> by her outburst.</i>
<b><u>unresponsive</u></b>	Not susceptible to suggestion or influence. <i>Was <b>unresponsive</b> to her passionate advances.</i>
<b>unruffled</b>	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension- Anthony Trollope. <i>With contented mind and <b>unruffled</b> spirit.</i>
<b>unsentimental</b>	Not displaying or influenced by sentimental feelings. <i>The speeches were short and <b>unsentimental</b>.</i>
