<u>unambiguous</u>	Not open to more than one interpretation. As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous .
<u>undeniable</u>	Unable to be denied or disputed. It is an undeniable fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.
univocal	Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion. A univocal set of instructions.
<u>unmistakable</u>	Clearly evident to the mind. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>

<u>certainty</u>	The state of being certain. The passing of the act made a general election a certainty .
<u>clarity</u>	The quality of being easy to see or hear; sharpness of image or sound. <i>The clarity of the picture.</i>
<u>clear</u>	Clear of charges or deductions. A clear profit.
clearly	Without doubt or question. <i>Her ability to write clearly.</i>
confirming	Indicating existence or presence of a suspected condition or pathogen.



decided	(of a quality) definite; unquestionable. <i>The sunshine is a decided improvement.</i>
<u>definite</u>	Precise; explicit and clearly defined. A definite drop in attendance.
definitive	A definitive postage stamp. <i>The definitive work on Greece.</i>
determinate	Precisely determined or limited or defined; especially fixed by rule or by a specific and constant cause. <i>Determinate</i> growth.
distinct	Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type. A tree related to but quite distinct from the European beech.
<u>evident</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>The arrangement had not been made</i> explicit .
incontestable	Not able to be disputed.
indisputable	Impossible to doubt or dispute. A far from indisputable fact.
limpid	Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity. <i>Limpid</i> blue eyes.
lucid	Bright or luminous. Write in a clear and lucid style.
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Obvious</i> errors.
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	(of music or other sound) clear and pure in tone. A pellucid brook.
perspicuity	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
perspicuous	Able to give an account or express an idea clearly. A perspicuous argument.
plain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. A plain girl with a freckled face.
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
simplicity	A lack of penetration or subtlety. <i>The simplicity of a crystal.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	Without concealment or deception; honest. A straightforward gaze.

<u>unmistakable</u>	Clearly evident to the mind. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
