| <u>unmistakable</u> | Clearly evident to the mind. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i> |

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| <u>apparent</u> | Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>The effects of the drought are apparent to anyone who sees the parched fields.</i> |
| <u>certainly</u> | Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm's appeal.</i> |
| <u>certainty</u> | The state of being certain. <i>The passing of the act made a general election a certainty.</i> |
| <u>clarity</u> | The quality of being easy to see or hear; sharpness of image or sound. <i>The clarity of the picture.</i> |
| <u>clear</u> | Clear of charges or deductions. <i>A clear profit.</i> |
| clearly | Without doubt or question. <i>Her ability to write clearly.</i> |
| confirming | Indicating existence or presence of a suspected condition or pathogen. |

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| decided | (of a quality) definite; unquestionable. <i>The sunshine is a decided improvement.</i> |
| <u>definite</u> | Precise; explicit and clearly defined. <i>A definite drop in attendance.</i> |
| definitive | A definitive postage stamp. <i>The definitive work on Greece.</i> |
| determinate | Precisely determined or limited or defined; especially fixed by rule or by a specific and constant cause. <i>Determinate growth.</i> |
| distinct | Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type. <i>A tree related to but quite distinct from the European beech.</i> |
| <u>evident</u> | Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.</i> |
| <u>explicit</u> | Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>The arrangement had not been made explicit.</i> |
| incontestable | Not able to be disputed. |
| indisputable | Impossible to doubt or dispute. <i>A far from indisputable fact.</i> |
| limpid | Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity. <i>Limpid blue eyes.</i> |
| <u>lucid</u> | Bright or luminous. <i>Write in a clear and lucid style.</i> |
| obvious | Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Obvious errors.</i> |
| palpability | The quality of being perceivable by touch. |
| pellucid | (of music or other sound) clear and pure in tone. <i>A pellucid brook.</i> |
| perspicuity | Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous. |
| perspicuous | Able to give an account or express an idea clearly. <i>A perspicuous argument.</i> |
| plain | Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>A plain girl with a freckled face.</i> |
| positivistic | Of or relating to positivism. |
| simplicity | A lack of penetration or subtlety. <i>The simplicity of a crystal.</i> |
| <u>straightforward</u> | Without concealment or deception; honest. <i>A straightforward gaze.</i> |
