- *(of a contest) not equally balanced.*



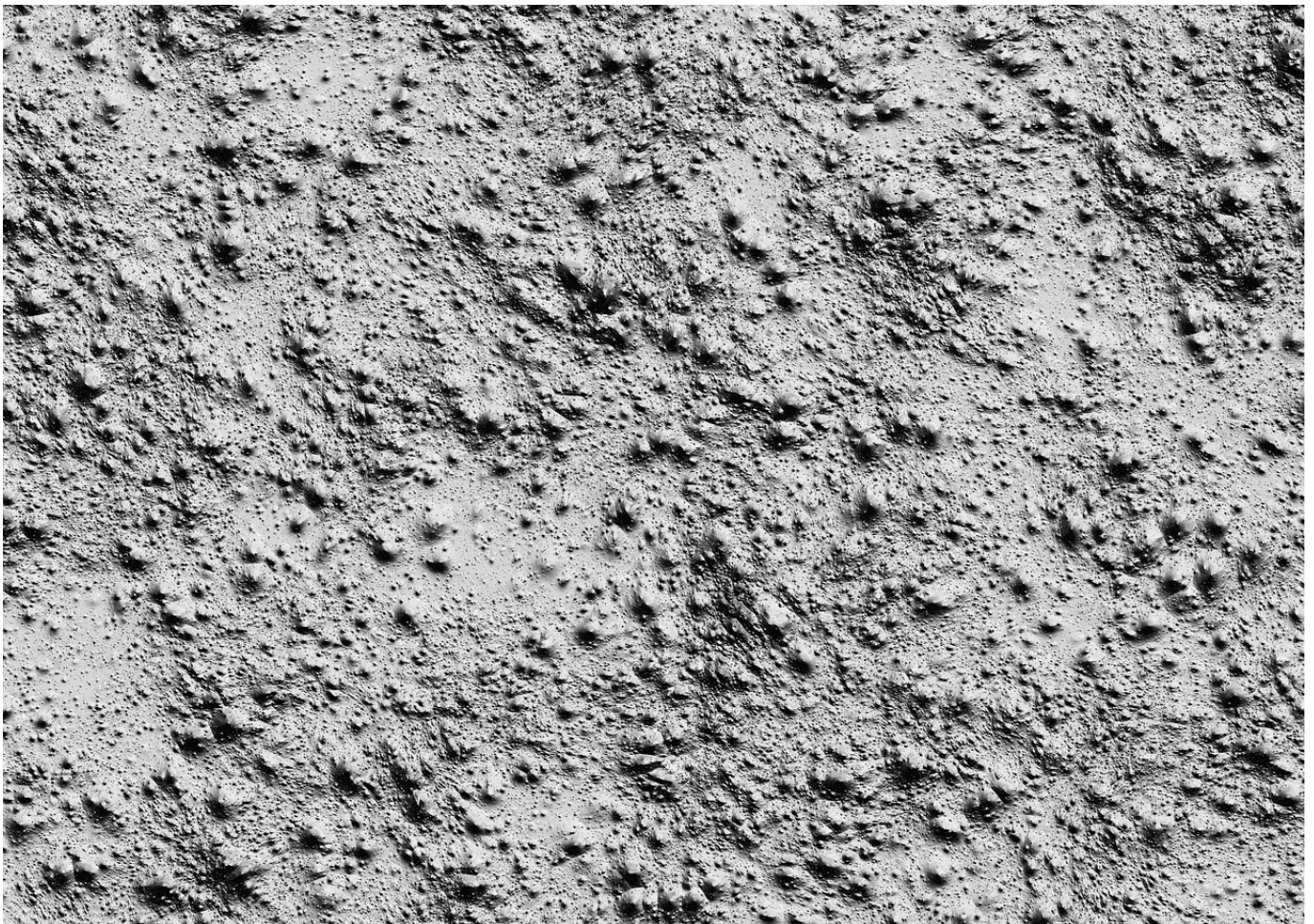

asymmetrical	Irregular in shape or outline. <i>The church has an asymmetrical plan with an aisle only on one side.</i>
awry	Turned or twisted toward one side. <i>He was hatless his silver hair awry.</i>
bitty	Very small. <i>The text is rather bitty.</i>
bumpy	Covered with or full of bumps. <i>A bumpy country road.</i>
changeable	Such that alteration is possible; having a marked tendency to change. <i>A changeable climate.</i>
cragged	Having hills and crags. <i>The cragged features of the fishermen.</i>

differing	Not the same as each other; dissimilar. <i>Widely differing circumstances.</i>
disproportionate	Out of proportion. <i>People on lower incomes spend a disproportionate amount of their income on fuel.</i>
dissimilar	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>A pump not dissimilar to those once found on every farm.</i>
erratic	Likely to perform unpredictably- Osbert Lancaster. <i>Erratic winds are the bane of a sailor.</i>
fluctuating	Rising and falling irregularly in number or amount. <i>A fluctuating level of demand.</i>
holey	Allowing passage in and out.
inconsistent	Acting at variance with one's own principles or former behaviour. <i>Inconsistent accounts.</i>
indented	Divided or edged with a zigzag line.
inequitable	Unfair; unjust. <i>Inequitable taxation.</i>
intermittent	Stopping and starting at irregular intervals. <i>Intermittent rain showers.</i>
irregular	Not having clear dimensions that can be measured; volume must be determined with the principle of liquid displacement. <i>An irregular pair of jeans.</i>
jagged	Having a sharply uneven surface or outline. <i>The jagged outline of the crags.</i>
knobby	Having knobs.
lopsided	Turned or twisted toward one side. <i>A lopsided grin.</i>
lumpy	(of water) formed by the wind into small waves. <i>There s a lumpy sea running.</i>
mismatched	Either not matched or unsuitably matched. <i>A pair of mismatched cops.</i>

not matching	Intentionally matched.
odd	Denoting a single goal by which one side defeats another, especially where each side scores at least once. <i>It is odd that his name is never mentioned.</i>
one-sided	Involving only one part or side.
patchy	Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc. <i>My knowledge of Egyptology is patchy.</i>
pitted	Pitted with cell like cavities as a honeycomb. <i>Pitted black olives.</i>
potholed	Used of paved surfaces having holes or pits.
rocky	Difficult and full of problems. <i>Older types of sash windows are a bit rocky.</i>
rough	(of wine or another alcoholic drink) sharp or harsh in taste. <i>The first day of a job is rough on everyone.</i>
rutted	Having long deep tracks made by the repeated passage of the wheels of vehicles. <i>A gruelling drive on rutted dirt roads.</i>
rutty	Full of ruts. <i>Rutty farm roads.</i>
scratchy	Lacking consistency. <i>Loudspeakers blaring a scratchy record.</i>
spotty	Lacking consistency. <i>The wall had a spotty speckled effect.</i>
stony	Made of or resembling stone. <i>Stony ground.</i>
unlike	(of two or more subjects) differing from each other; not similar. <i>They are unlike in personality.</i>
unbalanced	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She considered him to be mentally unbalanced and dangerous.</i>
unequal	Poorly balanced or matched in quantity or value or measure. <i>She was unequal to the task.</i>
unfair	Not fair; marked by injustice or partiality or deception. <i>Took an unfair advantage.</i>
unjust	Not based on or behaving according to what is morally right and fair. <i>Unjust punishment.</i>
unlike	Not like; different from. <i>They distributed unlike or unequal sums to the various charities.</i>

unsymmetrical	Having unsymmetrical parts or unequal dimensions or measurements. (used of a device) designed so that a property (as e.g. light) can be varied.
variable	<i>Variable</i> expenses.
varying	Differing in size, amount, degree, or nature. <i>Varying</i> degrees of success.
wavering	Undecided between two opinions or courses of action. <i>She gave a wavering smile.</i>

asymmetry	(mathematics) a lack of symmetry. <i>The global system is marked by great asymmetry the most important goods are controlled by groups in a relatively small number of countries.</i>
crooked	Having the back and shoulders rounded; not erect. Crooked teeth.
disparity	Inequality or difference in some respect. <i>The arrangements could lead to disparity of treatment between companies.</i>
disproportionate	Not proportionate. <i>People on lower incomes spend a disproportionate amount of their income on fuel.</i>
erratic	A rock or boulder that differs from the surrounding rock and is believed to have been brought from a distance by glacial action. <i>An erratic comet.</i>
imbalance	A lack of symmetry. <i>A hormonal imbalance.</i>
incapable	Unable to do or achieve (something). <i>He is incapable of understanding the matter.</i>
inconsistent	Not capable of being made consistent or harmonious. <i>He had done nothing inconsistent with his morality.</i>
instability	Unreliability attributable to being unstable. <i>Political and economic instability.</i>
irregular	A member of an irregular military force. <i>An irregular heartbeat.</i>
irregularity	The state or quality of being irregular. <i>There is evidence that fraud and irregularity continue on a large scale.</i>
jagged	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Her jagged nerves.</i>
lopsided	Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. <i>A lopsided grin.</i>
oblique	An oblique muscle. <i>It is the obliques and abdominals which create the well trained look.</i>
patchy	Not of the same quality throughout; inconsistent. <i>A patchy essay.</i>
quicksilver	Liable to sudden unpredictable change. <i>His quicksilver wit.</i>

ragged	Suffering from exhaustion or stress. <i>Hered the class into a ragged line.</i>
serrate	Serrated. <i>Leaves with serrate margins.</i>
serrated	Notched like a saw with teeth pointing toward the apex. <i>A knife with a serrated edge.</i>
<u>skew</u>	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The distributions were skewed to the right.</i>
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw toothed.</i>
unbalance	Throw out of balance or equilibrium. <i>There appears to be very little horizontal stress unbalance.</i>
unequal	A person or thing regarded as unequal to another in status or level. <i>She was unequal to the task.</i>
<u>unpredictable</u>	Not able to be predicted; changeable. <i>The unpredictable weather of the Scottish islands.</i>
<u>unsatisfactory</u>	Not giving satisfaction. <i>Our discussion was very unsatisfactory.</i>
wanting	Lacking in a required or necessary quality. <i>Tested and found wanting.</i>
<u>wavy</u>	Having a form or edge that smoothly curves in and out. <i>She had long wavy hair.</i>
