- *Not level or smooth.*
- *Lacking consistency.*
- *Not fairly matched as opponents.*
- *Variable and recurring at irregular intervals.*
- *Not regular, consistent, or equal.*
- *(of a contest or contestants) not fairly matched as opponents.*
- *Not divisible by two.*
- *(of a contest) not equally balanced.*

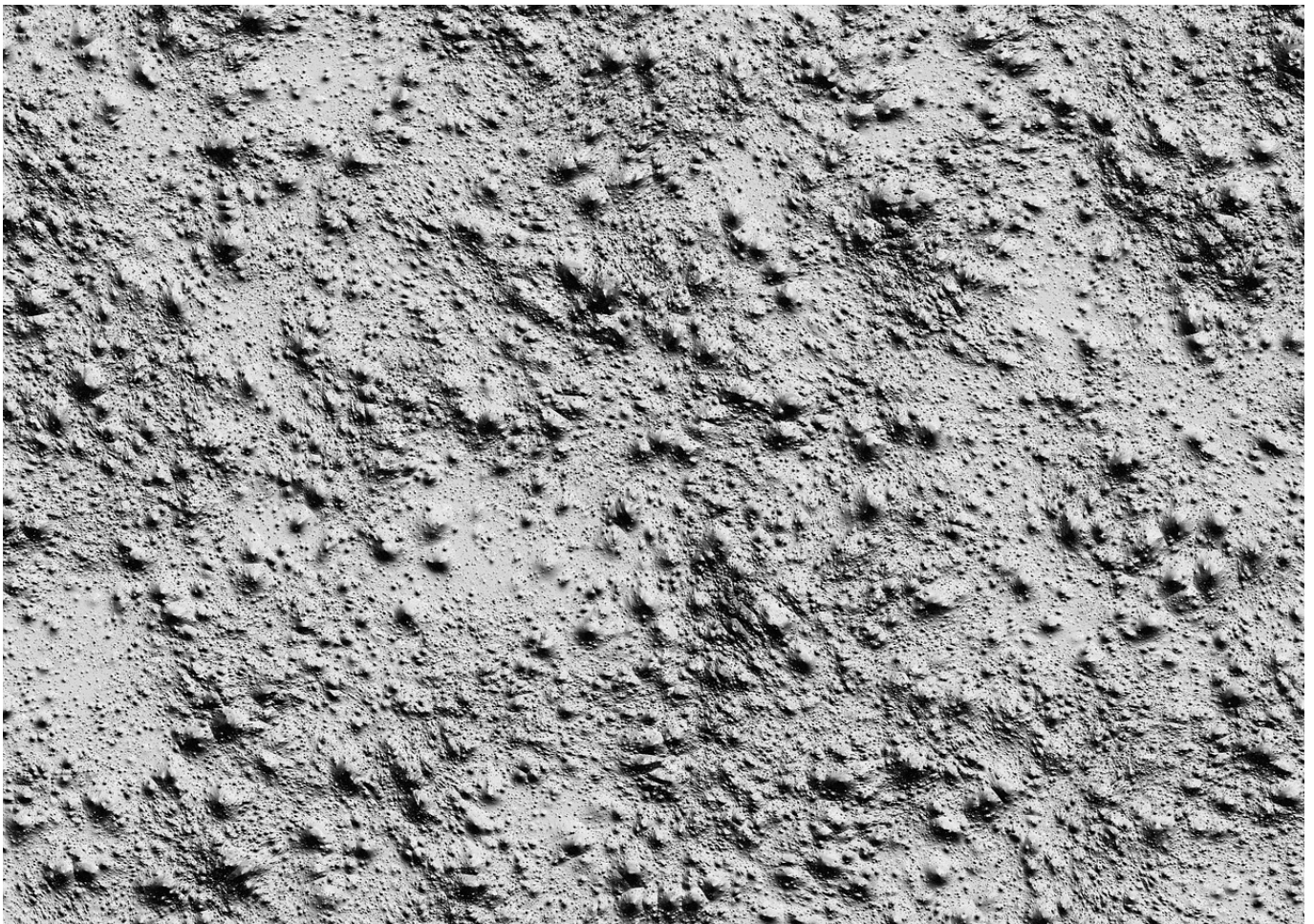
<b><a href="#">askew</a></b>	Turned or twisted toward one side. <i>The plan went sadly <b>askew</b>.</i>
<b>asymmetrical</b>	Irregular in shape or outline. <i>The church has an <b>asymmetrical</b> plan with an aisle only on one side.</i>
<b><a href="#">awry</a></b>	Turned or twisted toward one side. <i>He was hatless his silver hair <b>awry</b>.</i>
<b>bitty</b>	Very small. <i>The text is rather <b>bitty</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">bumpy</a></b>	Covered with or full of bumps. <i>A <b>bumpy</b> country road.</i>
<b>changeable</b>	Such that alteration is possible; having a marked tendency to change. <i>A <b>changeable</b> climate.</i>
<b>cragged</b>	Having hills and crags. <i>The <b>cragged</b> features of the fishermen.</i>

<b>craggy</b>	(of a cliff or rock face) rough and uneven. <i>A <b>craggy</b> coastline.</i>
<b>crooked</b>	Irregular in shape or outline. <i>It s not you I m <b>crooked</b> on he assured Vivien.</i>
<b>dented</b>	Of metal e.g. <i><b>Dented</b> fenders.</i>
<b>differing</b>	Not the same as each other; dissimilar. <i>Widely <b>differing</b> circumstances.</i>
<b>disproportionate</b>	Out of proportion. <i>People on lower incomes spend a <b>disproportionate</b> amount of their income on fuel.</i>
<b>dissimilar</b>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>A pump not <b>dissimilar</b> to those once found on every farm.</i>
<b>erratic</b>	Likely to perform unpredictably- Osbert Lancaster. <i><b>Erratic</b> winds are the bane of a sailor.</i>
<b>fluctuating</b>	Rising and falling irregularly in number or amount. <i>A <b>fluctuating</b> level of demand.</i>
<b>holey</b>	Allowing passage in and out.
<b>inconsistent</b>	Acting at variance with one's own principles or former behaviour. <i><b>Inconsistent</b> accounts.</i>
<b>indented</b>	Divided or edged with a zigzag line.
<b>inequitable</b>	Unfair; unjust. <i><b>Inequitable</b> taxation.</i>
<b>intermittent</b>	Stopping and starting at irregular intervals. <i><b>Intermittent</b> rain showers.</i>
<b>irregular</b>	Not having clear dimensions that can be measured; volume must be determined with the principle of liquid displacement. <i>An <b>irregular</b> pair of jeans.</i>
<b>jagged</b>	Having a sharply uneven surface or outline. <i>The <b>jagged</b> outline of the crags.</i>
<b>knobby</b>	Having knobs.
<b>lopsided</b>	Turned or twisted toward one side. <i>A <b>lopsided</b> grin.</i>
<b>lumpy</b>	(of water) formed by the wind into small waves. <i>There s a <b>lumpy</b> sea running.</i>
<b>mismatched</b>	Either not matched or unsuitably matched. <i>A pair of <b>mismatched</b> cops.</i>

<b>not matching</b>	Intentionally matched.
<b>odd</b>	Denoting a single goal by which one side defeats another, especially where each side scores at least once. <i>It is <b>odd</b> that his name is never mentioned.</i>
<b>one-sided</b>	Involving only one part or side.
<b>patchy</b>	Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc. <i>My knowledge of Egyptology is <b>patchy</b>.</i>
<b>pitted</b>	Pitted with cell like cavities as a honeycomb. <i><b>Pitted</b> black olives.</i>
<b>potholed</b>	Used of paved surfaces having holes or pits.
<b>rocky</b>	Difficult and full of problems. <i>Older types of sash windows are a bit <b>rocky</b>.</i>
<b>rough</b>	(of wine or another alcoholic drink) sharp or harsh in taste. <i>The first day of a job is <b>rough</b> on everyone.</i>
<b>rutted</b>	Having long deep tracks made by the repeated passage of the wheels of vehicles. <i>A gruelling drive on <b>rutted</b> dirt roads.</i>
<b>rutty</b>	Full of ruts. <i><b>Rutty</b> farm roads.</i>
<b>scratchy</b>	Lacking consistency. <i>Loudspeakers blaring a <b>scratchy</b> record.</i>
<b>spotty</b>	Lacking consistency. <i>The wall had a <b>spotty</b> speckled effect.</i>
<b>stony</b>	Made of or resembling stone. <i><b>Stony</b> ground.</i>
<b>unlike</b>	(of two or more subjects) differing from each other; not similar. <i>They are <b>unlike</b> in personality.</i>
<b>unbalanced</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She considered him to be mentally <b>unbalanced</b> and dangerous.</i>
<b>unequal</b>	Poorly balanced or matched in quantity or value or measure. <i>She was <b>unequal</b> to the task.</i>
<b>unfair</b>	Not fair; marked by injustice or partiality or deception. <i>Took an <b>unfair</b> advantage.</i>
<b>unjust</b>	Not based on or behaving according to what is morally right and fair. <i><b>Unjust</b> punishment.</i>
<b>unlike</b>	Not like; different from. <i>They distributed <b>unlike</b> or unequal sums to the various charities.</i>



- unsymmetrical** Having unsymmetrical parts or unequal dimensions or measurements.  
(used of a device) designed so that a property (as e.g. light) can be varied.
- variable** *Variable expenses.*
- varying** Differing in size, amount, degree, or nature.  
*Varying degrees of success.*
- wavering** Undecided between two opinions or courses of action.  
*She gave a **wavering** smile.*

Wrong; awry.  
*The judging was a bit **askew**.*

### **asymmetric**

Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.

### **asymmetrical**

Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.  
*The church has an **asymmetrical** plan with an aisle only on one side.*

<b>asymmetry</b>	(mathematics) a lack of symmetry. <i>The global system is marked by great <b>asymmetry</b> the most important goods are controlled by groups in a relatively small number of countries.</i>
<b>crooked</b>	Having the back and shoulders rounded; not erect. <b>Crooked</b> teeth.
<b>disparity</b>	Inequality or difference in some respect. <i>The arrangements could lead to <b>disparity</b> of treatment between companies.</i>
<b>disproportionate</b>	Not proportionate. <i>People on lower incomes spend a <b>disproportionate</b> amount of their income on fuel.</i>
<b>erratic</b>	A rock or boulder that differs from the surrounding rock and is believed to have been brought from a distance by glacial action. <i>An <b>erratic</b> comet.</i>
<b>imbalance</b>	A lack of symmetry. <i>A hormonal <b>imbalance</b>.</i>
<b>incapable</b>	Unable to do or achieve (something). <i>He is <b>incapable</b> of understanding the matter.</i>
<b>inconsistent</b>	Not capable of being made consistent or harmonious. <i>He had done nothing <b>inconsistent</b> with his morality.</i>
<b>instability</b>	Unreliability attributable to being unstable. <i>Political and economic <b>instability</b>.</i>
<b>irregular</b>	A member of an irregular military force. <i>An <b>irregular</b> heartbeat.</i>
<b>irregularity</b>	The state or quality of being irregular. <i>There is evidence that fraud and <b>irregularity</b> continue on a large scale.</i>
<b>jagged</b>	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Her <b>jagged</b> nerves.</i>
<b>lopsided</b>	Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. <i>A <b>lopsided</b> grin.</i>
<b>oblique</b>	An oblique muscle. <i>It is the <b>obliques</b> and abdominals which create the well trained look.</i>
<b>patchy</b>	Not of the same quality throughout; inconsistent. <i>A <b>patchy</b> essay.</i>
<b>quicksilver</b>	Liable to sudden unpredictable change. <i>His <b>quicksilver</b> wit.</i>

<b>ragged</b>	Suffering from exhaustion or stress. <i>Hered the class into a <b>ragged</b> line.</i>
<b>serrate</b>	Serrated. <i>Leaves with <b>serrate</b> margins.</i>
<b>serrated</b>	Notched like a saw with teeth pointing toward the apex. <i>A knife with a <b>serrated</b> edge.</i>
<u><a href="#">skew</a></u>	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The distributions were <b>skewed</b> to the right.</i>
<b>toothed</b>	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw <b>toothed</b>.</i>
<b>unbalance</b>	Throw out of balance or equilibrium. <i>There appears to be very little horizontal stress <b>unbalance</b>.</i>
<b>unequal</b>	A person or thing regarded as unequal to another in status or level. <i>She was <b>unequal</b> to the task.</i>
<u><a href="#">unpredictable</a></u>	Not able to be predicted; changeable. <i>The <b>unpredictable</b> weather of the Scottish islands.</i>
<u><a href="#">unsatisfactory</a></u>	Not giving satisfaction. <i>Our discussion was very <b>unsatisfactory</b>.</i>
<b>wanting</b>	Lacking in a required or necessary quality. <i>Tested and found <b>wanting</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">wavy</a></u>	Having a form or edge that smoothly curves in and out. <i>She had long <b>wavy</b> hair.</i>
