- without warning** Serving to warn.

<u>abrupt</u>	Steep; precipitous. <i>An abrupt canyon.</i>
abruptly	Steeply; precipitously. <i>The film ends rather abruptly.</i>
accidental	Incidental; subsidiary. <i>The location is accidental and contributes nothing to the poem.</i>
accidentally	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>They met accidentally.</i>
amazingly	Very impressively or well. <i>There are so many amazingly good clarets.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The dog was capable of astonishing tricks.</i>

awesome	Extremely good; excellent. <i>The awesome power of the atomic bomb.</i>
casually	In a relaxed and informal way. <i>I wouldn't introduce my family to people I was casually dating.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	The quality of occupying the same position or area in space. <i>They met by coincidence.</i>
curiously	With curiosity. <i>The baby looked around curiously.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance Santayana. <i>We just happened to meet Paul.</i>
<u>inadvertently</u>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.</i>
<u>incident</u>	Liable to happen because of; resulting from. <i>One person was stabbed in the incident.</i>
incidentally	Introducing a different topic; in point of fact. <i>Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
occur	(of a thought or idea) come into the mind of. <i>Nothing occurred that seemed important.</i>
overhear	Hear, usually without the knowledge of the speakers. <i>We overheard the conversation at the next table.</i>
<u>startling</u>	Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i>Startling news.</i>
<u>surprisingly</u>	In a way that causes surprise; unexpectedly. <i>Perhaps surprisingly all survived.</i>
unanticipated	Not anticipated. <i>Unanticipated and disconcerting lines of development.</i>
unconsciously	Without awareness. <i>Unconsciously she has spent her whole life looking for a man who could live up to the ideal of her father.</i>
unexpectedly	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>Tourist chiefs reported unexpectedly high visitor numbers.</i>
<u>unforeseen</u>	Not anticipated. <i>Our insurance package enables you to protect yourself and your dependants against unforeseen circumstances.</i>
unheralded	Without warning or announcement- M.A.D.Howe. <i>He was unwilling to make an unheralded entrance.</i>

- unintended** Not deliberate.
*The **unintended** consequences of people s actions.*
- unintentional** Done or made or performed with purpose and intent.
*An **unintentional** pun.*
- unintentionally** Not on purpose.
*She hit him **unintentionally**.*
- untoward** Contrary to your interests or welfare.
***Untoward** remarks.*
- unusually** In a way that is not habitual or common.
*The name is spelt **unusually**.*
- unwitting** Not done with purpose or intent.
*An **unwitting** accomplice.*
- windfall** A large amount of money that is won or received unexpectedly.
*Members are to get an average 520 cash **windfall** for voting yes to the merger.*
