Synonyms of "Unexplainable" as an adjective (29 Words)

abstruse	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>An abstruse philosophical inquiry.</i>
arcane	Requiring secret or mysterious knowledge. <i>The arcane science of dowsing.</i>
astonishing	Surprising greatly. <i>An astonishing achievement.</i>

baffling	Making great mental demands; hard to comprehend or solve or believe. <i>The crime is a baffling mystery for the police.</i>
<u>bewildering</u>	Confusing or perplexing. <i>There is a bewildering array of holidays to choose from.</i>
bizarre	Very strange or unusual. <i>His behaviour became more and more bizarre.</i>
curious	Beyond or deviating from the usual or expected. <i>Curious about the neighbor s doings.</i>
enigmatic	Not clear to the understanding. <i>Prophetic texts so enigmatic that their meaning has been disputed for centuries.</i>
extraordinary	(of an official) specially employed in addition to the usual staff. <i>An extraordinary achievement.</i>
freakish	Characteristic of a freak. <i>Freakish weather.</i>
impenetrable	(of matter) incapable of occupying the same space as other matter at the same time. <i>Impenetrable jargon.</i>
incomprehensible	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. <i>The most incomprehensible thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
<u>inexplicable</u>	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. <i>Inexplicable errors.</i>
inscrutable	Of an obscure nature- Rachel. <i>Guy looked blankly inscrutable.</i>
insoluble	Incapable of being dissolved. <i>An insoluble problem.</i>
mysterious	Of an obscure nature. <i>His colleague had vanished in mysterious circumstances.</i>
mystifying	Of an obscure nature. <i>Rituals totally mystifying to visitors from other lands.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Remote and separate physically or socially. <i>An impulse to go off and fight certain obscure battles of his own spirit.</i>
<u>odd</u>	Not easily explained. <i>It s odd that she didn t recognize me.</i>

peculiar	Markedly different from the usual. <i>The peculiar character of the Government of the U S.</i>
perplexing	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A perplexing problem.</i>
puzzling	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A puzzling statement.</i>
strange	Relating to or originating in or characteristic of another place or part of the world. <i>She was lost in a strange country.</i>
unaccountable	(of a person, organization, or institution) not required or expected to justify actions or decisions; not responsible for results or consequences. <i>A strange and unaccountable fact.</i>
unfathomable	Impossible to come to understand. <i>Mountains of unfathomable scale.</i>
unparalleled	Radically distinctive and without equal. <i>Unparalleled athletic ability.</i>
unsolvable	Not solved. <i>Public finance had long presented problems unsolvable or at least unsolved.</i>
unusual	Not usual or common or ordinary. <i>A man of unusual ability.</i>
