### **Definitions of "Unfamiliarity" as a noun**

- *The quality of not being known or recognized.*
- *Lack of knowledge or experience of something.*
- *Unusualness as a consequence of not being well known.*



## Synonyms of "Unfamiliarity" as a noun (1 Word)

**strangeness** The state or fact of being strange.  
*The **strangeness** of a foreigner.*

## Usage Examples of "Unfamiliarity" as a noun

- *The relative unfamiliarity of the Scandinavian songs.*
- *Her unfamiliarity with the area results in her getting lost.*
- *A word can excite by its very unfamiliarity.*
- *Counterfeiters exploited people's unfamiliarity with the currency.*

## Associations of "Unfamiliarity" (30 Words)

**anonymous** (of a person) not identified by name; of unknown name.  
***Anonymous** bureaucrats in the Civil Service.*

**baffle** A device used to restrain the flow of a fluid, gas, etc. or to prevent the spreading of sound or light in a particular direction.  
*An unexplained occurrence that **baffled** everyone.*

<b>befuddle</b>	Make stupid with alcohol. <i>The logic used to arrive at this conclusion <b>befuddles</b> me.</i>
<b>confound</b>	Mistake one thing for another. <i>The inflation figure <b>confounded</b> economic analysts.</i>
<b>confuse</b>	Mistake one thing for another. <i>The points made by the authors <b>confuse</b> rather than clarify the issue.</i>
<b>enigmatic</b>	Resembling an oracle in obscurity of thought. <i>He took the money with an <b>enigmatic</b> smile.</i>
<b>freshness</b>	Originality by virtue of being new and surprising. <i>The <b>freshness</b> of the air revived him.</i>
<b>inexperienced</b>	Lacking practical experience or training. <i>An <b>inexperienced</b> driver.</i>
<b>inglorious</b>	Not famous or renowned. <i>Some mute <b>inglorious</b> Milton here may rest.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	(of a child) illegitimate. <i>Corporations responsible to <b>nameless</b> owners.</i>
<b><u>newfound</u></b>	Newly discovered. <i>Hudson pointed his ship down the coast of the <b>newfound</b> sea.</i>
<b><u>occult</u></b>	(of a disease or process) not accompanied by readily discernible signs or symptoms. <i>The typically <b>occult</b> language of the time.</i>
<b><u>odd</u></b>	Of the remaining member of a pair, of socks e.g. <i>Invited 30 <b>odd</b> guests.</i>
<b>perplex</b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She was <b>perplexed</b> by her husband s moodiness.</i>
<b><u>puzzling</u></b>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A <b>puzzling</b> statement.</i>
<b><u>shameful</u></b>	Worthy of or causing shame or disgrace. <i>A <b>shameful</b> display of cowardice.</i>
<b>strange</b>	Not previously visited, seen, or encountered; unfamiliar or alien. <i>Children have some <b>strange</b> ideas.</i>
<b>stupefy</b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to <b>stupefy</b> her.</i>
<b><u>unappreciated</u></b>	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>

<b><u>undetected</u></b>	Not perceived or discerned. <i>She looked around to be sure her faux pas was <b>undetected</b>.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Eluding diagnosis. <i>Some patients have diseases that go <b>undiagnosed</b> and therefore untreated.</i>
<b><u>undiscovered</u></b>	Not discovered. <i><b>Undiscovered</b> islands.</i>
<b>unidentified</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An <b>unidentified</b> species.</i>
<b>uninitiated</b>	Not initiated; deficient in relevant experience. <i>The discussion wasn't easy to follow for the <b>uninitiated</b>.</i>
<b><u>unintentionally</u></b>	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. <i>She hit him <b>unintentionally</b>.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>Find the <b>unknown</b> in the following equations.</i>
<b><u>unnamed</u></b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An <b>unnamed</b> donor.</i>
<b><u>unrelated</u></b>	Not connected by kinship. <i>Households containing two or more <b>unrelated</b> people.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Not celebrated or praised. <i><b>Unsung</b> heroes of the war.</i>
<b>whereabouts</b>	Where or approximately where. <i>His <b>whereabouts</b> remain secret.</i>
