(of a person) not identified by name; of unknown name. anonymous

Anonymous bureaucrats in the Civil Service.

A device used to restrain the flow of a fluid, gas, etc. or to prevent the

spreading of sound or light in a particular direction.

An unexplained occurrence that **baffle**d everyone.

Mistake one thing for another. confound

Originality by virtue of being new and surprising. freshness

The **freshness** of the air revived him.

Lacking practical experience or training. inexperienced

An **inexperienced** driver.

Not famous or renowned. inglorious

Some mute **inglorious** Milton here may rest.

(of a child) illegitimate. nameless

Corporations responsible to **nameless** owners.

Newly discovered. newfound

Hudson pointed his ship down the coast of the **newfound** sea.

(of a disease or process) not accompanied by readily discernible signs or

occult symptoms.

The typically **occult** language of the time.

Of the remaining member of a pair, of socks e.g. odd

Invited 30 odd guests.

She was **perplex**ed by her husband s moodiness.

Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. puzzling

Not previously visited, seen, or encountered; unfamiliar or alien. strange

Children have some **strange** ideas.

Be a mystery or bewildering to.

stupefy The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to **stupefy**

Having value that is not acknowledged.

She had been brought up in a family where she felt **unappreciated** and <u>unappreciated</u>

undervalued.



undetected Not perceived or discerned.

She looked around to be sure her faux pas was **undetected**.

Eluding diagnosis.

undiagnosed Some patients have diseases that go **undiagnosed** and therefore

untreated.

undiscovered Not discovered.

Undiscovered islands.

unidentified Being or having an unknown or unnamed source.

An unidentified species.

uninitiatedNot initiated; deficient in relevant experience.

The discussion wasn t easy to follow for the **uninitiated**.

without intention; in an unintentional manner.

She hit him **unintentionally**.

unknownBeing or having an unknown or unnamed source.
