inscrutable Of an obscure nature- Rachel.

Guy looked blankly **inscrutable**.

mysterious Of an obscure nature.

A dark **mysterious** windowless building.

mystifying

Utterly bewildering or perplexing.

Rituals totally **mystifying** to visitors from other lands.

**obscure** Marked by difficulty of style or expression.

An **obscure** turn of phrase.



profound Deep and complete.

A case of **profound** liver failure.

Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity.

A **puzzling** statement.

(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or

**secretive** conspiratorial quality.

She was very **secretive** about her past.

Not fully explored or understood.

**unfathomed** Throughout the book her emotions remain relatively opaque and

unfathomed.

Situated at or extending to great depth; too deep to have been

**unplumbed** sounded or plumbed-Thomas Gray.
