unfortunate person A person who suffers misfortune.



### Definitions of "Unfortunate" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "unfortunate" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Having or marked by bad fortune; unlucky.
- Not auspicious; boding ill.
- Regrettable or inappropriate.
- Unsuitable or regrettable.
- Not indicating a good chance of success; inauspicious.
- Not favored by fortune; marked or accompanied by or resulting in ill fortune.






# Synonyms of "Unfortunate" as an adjective (24 Words)

<u>adverse</u>	Preventing success or development; harmful; unfavourable. <i>Taxes are having an</i> <b>adverse</b> <i>effect on production.</i>
disadvantageous	Involving or creating unfavourable circumstances that reduce the chances of success or effectiveness. <i>A disadvantageous</i> outcome.
down on one's luck	Understood perfectly.
<u>forlorn</u>	Marked by or showing hopelessness. The last <b>forlorn</b> attempt.
hapless	Deserving or inciting pity. A <b>hapless</b> victim.
inappropriate	Not suitable for a particular occasion etc. Completely <b>inappropriate</b> behavior.
inapt	Not suitable or appropriate in the circumstances. A more <b>inapt</b> name I cannot imagine.
inauspicious	Contrary to your interests or welfare. Following this <b>inauspicious</b> start the British outnumbered withdrew.
infelicitous	Unfortunate; inappropriate. An <b>infelicitous</b> remark.
injudicious	Showing very poor judgement; unwise. I took a few <b>injudicious</b> swigs of potent cider.
luckless	Having or bringing misfortune. An osprey seized the <b>luckless</b> fish with its talons.
<u>miserable</u>	Very unhappy; full of misery. You <b>miserable</b> old creep.
out of luck	Out of power; especially having been unsuccessful in an election.
<u>pitiful</u>	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>Pitiful</i> exhibition of cowardice.
poor	Deserving or inciting pity. The jejune diets of the very <b>poor</b> .
regrettable	(of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome. It s <b>regrettable</b> that she didn t go to college.
<u>tactless</u>	Lacking or showing a lack of what is fitting and considerate in dealing with others. It was <b>tactless</b> to bring up those disagreeable.



unfavourable	Not favorable. Single mothers are often the target of <b>unfavourable</b> press attention.
unhappy	Not happy. An <b>unhappy</b> coincidence.
unlucky	Having, bringing, or resulting from bad luck. An <b>unlucky</b> defeat.
<u>unsuitable</u>	Not fitting or appropriate. The display is <b>unsuitable</b> for young children.
<u>untoward</u>	Unexpected and inappropriate or inconvenient. Both tried to behave as if nothing <b>untoward</b> had happened.
<u>unwelcome</u>	(of a guest or new arrival) not gladly received. <b>Unwelcome</b> attentions from men.
wretched	Of very poor quality or condition. The <b>wretched</b> conditions of the slums.

#### **bereft**

Unhappy in love; suffering from unrequited love. **Bereft** of hope.



calamitous	(of events) having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. Such <b>calamitous</b> events as fires hurricanes and floods.
defeated	People who are defeated. She looked <b>defeated</b> quite unlike her normal self.
<u>disadvantaged</u>	Marked by deprivation especially of the necessities of life or healthful environmental influences. We began to help the <b>disadvantaged</b> .
<u>disastrous</u>	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. The battle was a <b>disastrous</b> end to a <b>disastrous</b> campaign.
fateful	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. A <b>fateful</b> oversight.
<u>foreboding</u>	A feeling that something bad will happen; fearful apprehension. When the Doctor spoke his voice was dark and <b>foreboding</b> .
<u>frustrating</u>	Discouraging by hindering. It can be very <b>frustrating</b> to find that the size you want isn t there.
hapless	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. A <b>hapless</b> victim.
inauspicious	Presaging ill fortune- P.B.Shelley. My words with <b>inauspicious</b> thunderings shook heaven.
infelicitous	Marked by or producing unhappiness. The <b>infelicitous</b> typesetting was due to illegible copy.
misadventure	An unfortunate incident; a mishap. The petty misdemeanours and <b>misadventure</b> s of childhood.
mischance	An instance of misfortune. By pure <b>mischance</b> the secret was revealed.
<u>miserable</u>	Causing unhappiness or discomfort. Almost depleted his <b>miserable</b> store of dried beans.
mournful	Expressing sorrow. Stared with <b>mournful</b> eyes.
ominous	Presaging ill fortune. There were <b>ominous</b> dark clouds gathering overhead.
<u>pathetic</u>	Miserably inadequate; of very low standard. The shabby room struck her as extraordinarily <b>pathetic</b> .
piteous	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>Piteous</i> appeals for help.



pitiable	Contemptibly poor or small. The men were in a <b>pitiable</b> condition.
<u>pitiful</u>	Deserving or inciting pity. A <b>pitiful</b> fate.
premonition	An early warning about a future event. He had a <b>premonition</b> of imminent disaster.
presentiment	An intuitive feeling about the future, especially one of foreboding. A <b>presentiment</b> of disaster.
<u>tragic</u>	Suffering extreme distress or sorrow. A <b>tragic</b> accident.
<u>underprivileged</u>	Lacking the rights and advantages of other members of society. The plight of the <b>underprivileged</b> .
unfulfilled	Of persons; marked by failure to realize full potentialities. <i>I was restless and <b>unfulfilled</b>.</i>
unhappy	Causing discomfort. After the argument they lapsed into an <b>unhappy</b> silence.
unlucky	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott. The visitors were <b>unlucky</b> to have a goal disallowed.
unpropitious	(of a circumstance) not giving or indicating a good chance of success; unfavourable. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially</i> <b>unpropitious</b> <i>time</i> .
<u>unsuccessful</u>	Not successful. An <b>unsuccessful</b> attempt to enter Parliament.
wretched	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. Spent a <b>wretched</b> night on the floor.
